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A series of slow moving thunderstorms produced several inches of rain in the Mobile metro in just a few hours. Mobile Regional Airport recorded a storm total of 7.79 inches.

An off-duty employee reported 10-12 inches of water cover Airport Blvd just west of I-65. Numerous cars were flooded and people had to be rescued from their cars. Dauphin St near Du Rhu Dr was impassable. Flooding was also reported on parts of Old Shell Rd as well as near Grelot Rd and Hillcrest Rd. A parking lot at the University of South Alabama was severely flooded with water entering some parked vehicles.
