A narrow path of wind damage was surveyed at the Little Mountain Marina northeast of Guntersville. The path begins at the lake shore where a tree was uprooted. Marina buildings suffered minor damage; several windows were broken and some roofing was torn off. Several tree branches were broken and small tree trunks (all 6 inches in diameter or less) were snapped, and a flagpole and a TV antenna were bent. The final damage of note occurred near Murphy Hill Road, where two isolated pine trees were snapped in a larger grove of pine trees.

Witnesses reported seeing a "waterspout without water" form over Lake Guntersville and move ashore, causing the damage. Another witness noted that the "waterspout" formed "along the cold front". All of the eyewitness accounts note that it occurred without any rain.

A line of thunderstorms pushed east into northwest and north central Alabama during the early and mid morning hours of the 14th and tracked into northeast Alabama during the early afternoon hours. Isolated reports of wind damage were received. A storm survey was needed to assess a narrow path of damage at a marina northeast of Guntersville in Marshall County.

A couple of trees and a street sign were blown down in western Houston county.

Widespread showers and thunderstorms ahead of a cold front lifted northward across the tri-state area on Sunday, April 22, 2018. While overall damage reports with the thunderstorms were limited, strong low level shear caused rotation in numerous storms. Despite the strong low level shear, instability was limited and the resultant storm mode was mini-supercells. A few reports of trees and even a downed street sign were reported in Houston county, AL. Despite the low-topped convection, the core of one storm in Lanier county, GA was also strong enough to produce nickel sized hail. While rotation was noted in multiple storms and a few tornado warnings were issued, only one storm produced a tornado that moved through Dale county, AL.

Five to nine inches of rain fell in a short duration along and east and west of the Highway 43 corridor from Thomasville to southwest of Grove Hill. At the height of the flash flood event, Highway 43 near Bassett Creek was covered in 6 feet of water. Several other roads in this area were also submerged in several feet of water, including Butler Drive in Thomasville. Multiple vehicles were submerged across the area. Approximately 20 water rescues had to be made from houses and residences with rescues reported 5 miles southwest of Grove Hill up toward Fulton. 25 homes experienced significant flooding. The

flash flooding also resulted in significant infrastructure damage to roads, water lines, and drainage. The Clarke County Emergency Management Director

reported 9.2 inches of rainfall.

A deep upper level low moved into the lower Mississippi Valley and pushed a cold front into the southeast states. The front temporarily stalled over portions of southeast Mississippi and southwest Alabama during the afternoon and evening of April 14th. This resulted in the training of thunderstorms, which resulted in flash flooding across portions of inland southwest Alabama. As the front began to move east that night, one severe weather event occurred in Mobile County.

The EF-1 tornado touched down just prior to crossing Jeffcoast Road, then moved north-northeast destroying a manufactured home, causing moderate damage to a second manufactured home, destroyed a shed, and uprooted and snapped large trees, one of which fell on a vehicle. The tornado was at its widest as it cut through a grove of trees and open fields before crossing Chapel Hill Road. A metal roof was then torn off a barn and thrown one-third of a mile back to the south. The tornado then caused sporadic damage as it passed through mainly wooded areas uprooting and snapping large trees, with one falling on a house causing minor damage, before lifting near Center Ridge Road.

A severe thunderstorm moved across the Florida state line into rural southeastern Escambia County in Alabama and produced areas of sporadic straight line wind damage.
