Heavy rainfall associated with Tropical Depression Claudette produced widespread flooding across northern Cherokee County during the evening hours on June 19th and the early morning hours on June 20th. Flooding reports include one foot of water overflowing County Road 15 and numerous other roads flooded across the northern part of the county.

Heavy rainfall impacted much of Central Alabama June 19-20 as the remnants of Tropical Storm Claudette moved across the area. Significant flooding occurred along the I-20 corridor where storm total amounts were in the 3-6 inch range, with isolated amounts near 8 inches. Near Tuscaloosa, a private dam failed and the subsequent flooding washed out a water and sewer main at Nucor Corporation's steel plant. This in turn damaged the city's sewage system, prompting officials to issue water restrictions for 100,000 people. Flooding destroyed 5 homes and severely damaged 38 in Northport and Tuscaloosa. Residential and infrastructure damage between the two cities reached \$3.35 million.

A band of very heavy rainfall developed well north of the track of Tropical Depression Claudette that moved across central Alabama. This rain band occurred during the late afternoon through the evening of the 19th into the very early morning hours of the 20th. Rainfall amounts of 5-10 inches were observed (ground truth) and estimated by radar. A CoCoRaHS observer reported 9.83 inches of rain atop Lookout Mountain about 3 miles south of Fort Payne. Another personal weather station measured 10.56 inches about 2 miles NNW of Rainsville. Excessive runoff led to significant flash flooding in a few areas, including along the Big Wills Creek in Fort Payne, and atop Lookout Mountain. Sadly, flash flooding took the life of a young woman along Dye Branch in Fort Payne, whose vehicle was swept off the road.

The tornado began to weaken as it moved north of west Cleveland Avenue but still produced spotty EF-0 to EF-1 damage all the way north to Interstate 65 where some tree damage was noted just north of the rest area. This is near where the tornado is estimated to have lifted. The survey team found no damage crossing Highway 84 further to the north. Escambia County Emergency Management reported up to 20 total injuries, mostly minor. However, there were 2 serious inj
