Multiple reports of street flooding in northern Hoover and Vestavia Hills, including on Highway 31 and Southland Drive. Highway 31 was shut down between Vestavia Pkwy and McGuire Rd. Several cars were temporarily stranded in floodwaters along roadways or in parking lots before water receded.

Around 4-6" inches of rain in Piedmont and in the mountains immediately south of Piedmont (i.e. Dugger Mountain) led to flooding issues during the overnight hours, particularly along Nances Creek and its nearby tributaries around town. Numerous roads in the city were flooded, with some homes taking on water. This included the area along Cook St near Highway 278.

Numerous roadways were flooded or washed out in southern and southeastern Cherokee County, including the Spring Garden area. Impacted roadways included CR 18, CR 12, CR 29, CR 177, CR 8, and Alabama Highway 9. Approximately 4-7" of rain fell in this part of the county. After the flash flooding event, runoff into the Terrapin Creek basin led Terrapin Creek along Highway 9 south of Centre to rise into minor flood stage for a few hours.

Heavy rain fell over Cleburne County for several hours during the early morning of August 3. Rainfall totals across the southern part of the county between Ranburne and Heflin were generally up to 5-8", with as high as 8-10" estimated by radar in the area of Turkey Heaven Mountain and corroborated by local reports. Numerous roadways were flooded or washed out, along with a bridge on CR 640. Impacted roadways included CR 10 at CR 635, CR 41, CR 633, and CR 640 all around Knoles Creek. Around 4:40 am CDT, a vehicle became stranded in high water on CR 10 at CR 635, and the occupant needed to be rescued. Around 6:20 am CDT, another vehicle became stuck in floodwaters along CR 41. Two occupants of the vehicle were swept away. One was rescued with minor injuries, while the second was found deceased a couple hours later.

Emergency management, police, and fire provided reports of other flooded or washed out roads, which included CR 10 near Pineywood Creek, CR 75 at CR 42 along Sheep Creek, CR 19 at CR 118, CR 36 at Dymne Creek near Greens Chapel, CR 49 at the Tallapoosa River near Abernathy, and CR 49 at CR 48 near Macedonia.

Streams flowing northward into the Tallapoosa River resulted in the river rising to minor flood stage near Heflin during the morning and midday hours.

<p>Chosea Springs Rd and Iron City Cutoff Rd were both closed due to flooding along Choccolocco Creek during the afternoon of the 3rd. Part of Old Downing Mill Rd was flooded as well. Later that evening, Mellon Bridge Rd in Oxford was also closed along the creek. The creek rose in the Choccolocco and Oxford areas in response to heavy rainfall the night before, in which 3-6" of rain fell in the headwaters of Choccolocco Creek south of Dugger Mountain.</p>				

Slow-moving thunderstorms occurred during the afternoon of August 1. One storm dumped 2-3" of rain over a localized area of Vestavia Hills and northern Hoover in less than an hour, resulting in numerous street flooding issues along Highway 31 and nearby roadways. The next day, heavy rainfall developed along a boundary between the I-59 and I-20 corridors in northeast Central Alabama during the afternoon and evening hours. Heavy rain continued into the overnight and early on the 3rd, with up to 5-7" of rain falling in different areas of Cherokee, Calhoun, and Cleburne counties. Radar estimates indicated up to 8-10" over the Turkey Heaven Mountain area west of Ranburne in Cleburne County. Flooding was reported around Centre, Piedmont, southern Cherokee County, and southern Cleburne County. Numerous roadways were flooded and washed out, and one person was killed after being swept from a vehicle in Cleburne County and recovered a couple hours later.

Significant street flooding was observed in areas, including 50th St N at 1st Ave N (U.S. 11), Coosa St at Richard Arrington Jr Blvd, and Oporto Madrid Blvd at Ludington Ln. 2.5 to 3.5 inches of rain fell across the eastern part of downtown Birmingham, including near the airport, and the western part of Irondale, generally in the area of I-20.				

A strong thunderstorm line segment moved south from DeKalb County into Cherokee County during the late afternoon of August 20, producing scattered instances of wind damage across the county, including around Centre, Leesburg, Sand Rock, Cedar Bluff, and Broomtown. Single trees fell onto homes in a couple instances, causing damage. Approximately 2600 power outages were reported to Cherokee Electric. Additionally, a tree fell on a kayaker along Terrapin Creek, resulting in an injury.

A short while later, heavy rain across parts of downtown Birmingham and Irondale resulted in several instances of street flooding after as much as 2.5-3.5" of rain fell.

Meanwhile, more extensive flooding took place around Meriwether Rd in Pike Road, with the roadway being closed after radar estimates of 4-5" of rain fell in the immediate area.
