


Mountain Snow and Plains Cold

Key Messages

- \rightarrow Heavy mountain snow through Saturday resulting in hazardous travel through the mountains
- → Heaviest snow and worst travel conditions across the Park Range and northern Front Range
- \rightarrow Bitterly cold temperatures for the plains and I-25 corridor Sunday through **Tuesday morning**

→ Advisory added for I-70 mountain corridor

Key Points



Heaviest Snow Expected Friday evening, rates up to 3"/hr US-40 Rabbit Ears Pass corridor

Expect 10-24" of snow accumulation through Saturday. Heaviest for the Park Range

4-8" possible for the I-70 corridor through Saturday

Travel Impacts




Travel could be very difficult Friday evening through Saturday morning in the northern mountains



If you must travel keep an emergency kit in your vehicle and check road conditions by calling 5-1-1





Percent Chance of Exceeding 4" and 8"





Forecast Confidence Levels




Travel Impacts



With light snow or flurries expected, travel impacts should remain minor across the plains.





Plains and I-25 Urban Corridor





Plains and I-25 Urban Corridor





Bitter Cold and Snow Safety Tips

Impact

- Danger of frostbite, hypothermia
- Risk of livestock and pet loss

- Possible frozen pipes and water damage
- Slick roads and hazardous travel

Safety Tips

- Avoid prolonged outdoor exposure
- Dress in multiple layers of warm clothing, including hat, mittens, scarves, and boots
- If you have plumbing susceptible to freezing, open cabinets or allow a slow drip
- Keep pets indoors, check on/protect livestock, and ensure an open water
