## Clarified Version of the Fire Danger Statement Begins March 1, 2021

As part of the National Weather Service's effort to simplify hazardous weather text products, NWS Brownsville/Rio Grande Valley has modified the Fire Danger Statement (World Meteorological Organization code FNUS64 KBRO RFDBRO) to match a bullet point format that is currently used in most other hazardous weather text products, including the related Red Flag Warning and Fire Weather Watch. The new format replaces the paragraph style with bullets (\*), which will include the following parameters:

- Timing
- 20 Foot Wind
- Relative Humidity
- Fuel Condition
- Impacts
