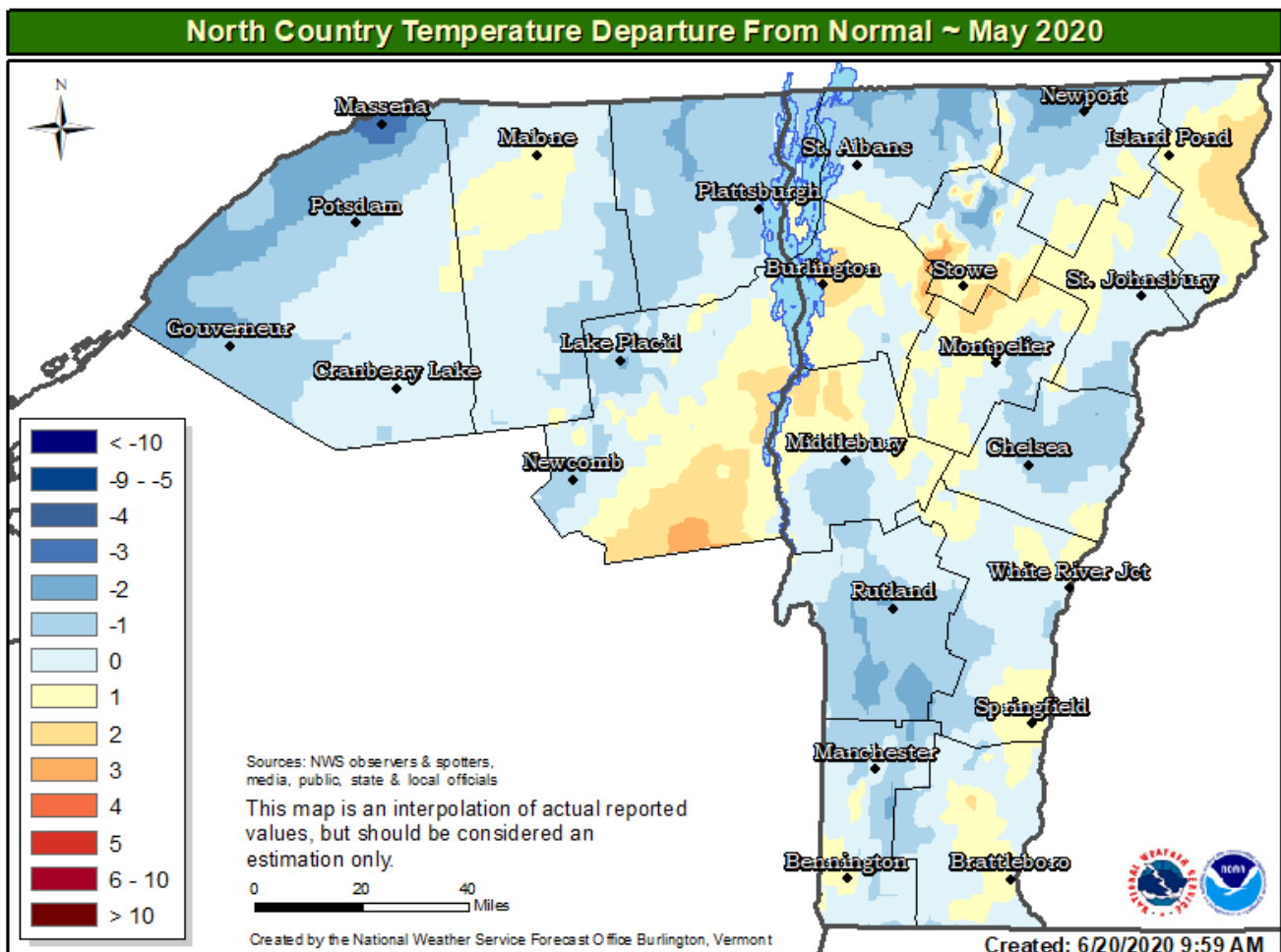

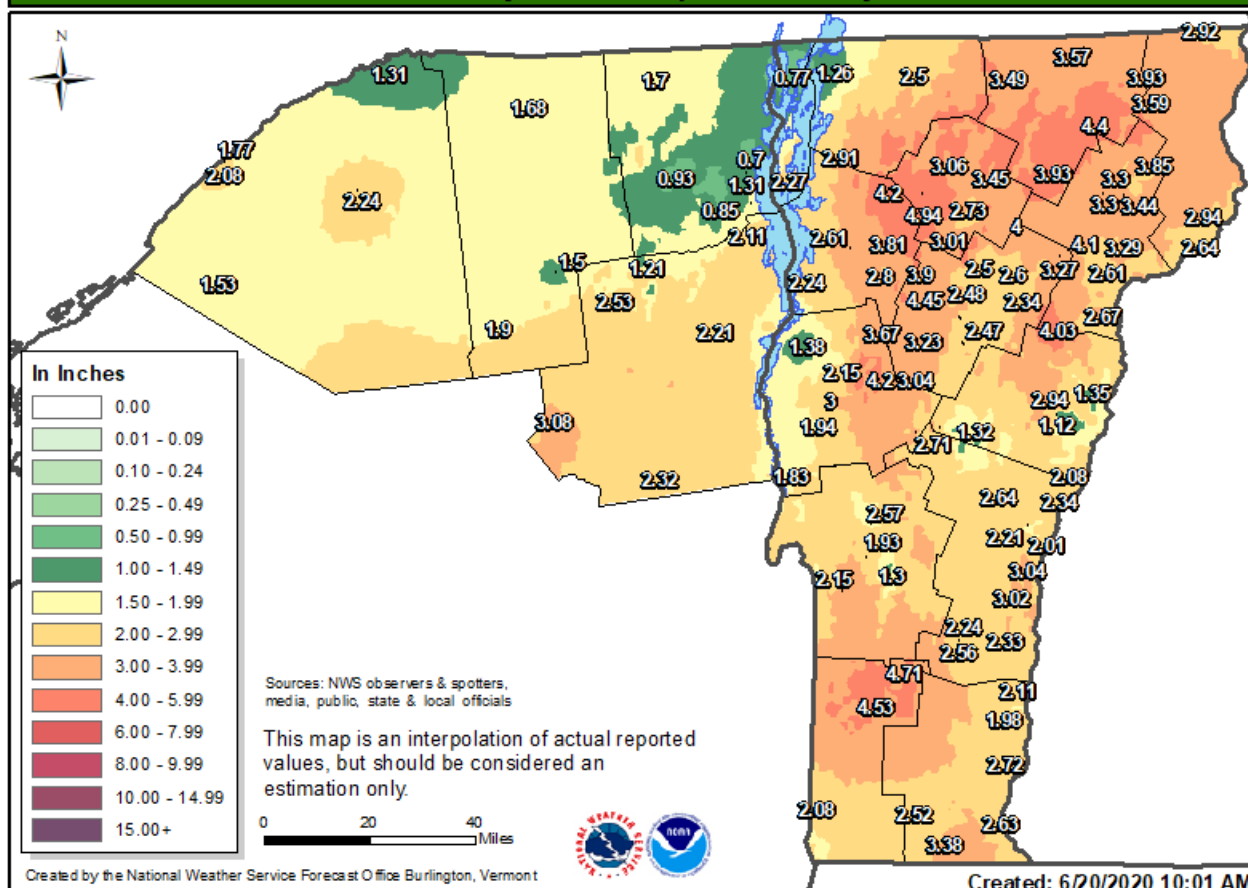

An X inside this box indicates that no flooding occurred within this hydrologic service area.

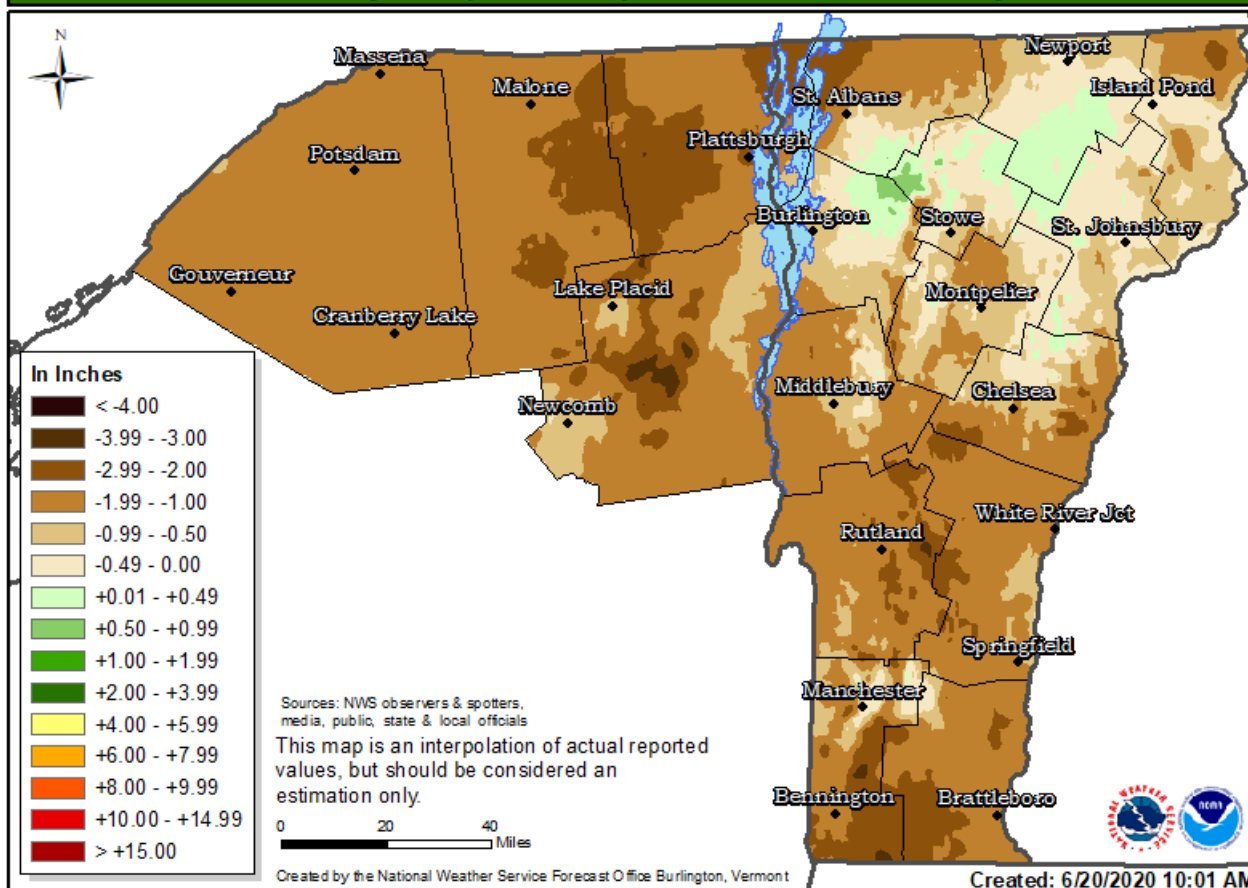
The month of May brought a rollercoaster of weather across the North Country. Winter lingered through the first half of May with below normal temperatures and several snowfall events. Towards the end of the month, record high temperatures occurred along with several rounds of severe weather. Despite the highly variable weather, the North Country saw largely below normal precipitation and temperatures during the month of May (although some variability occurred across some locations in Burlington's HSA where slightly above normal temperatures and precipitation were observed). No significant flooding was recorded across the Burlington HSA.
