
NEW Highlights

- → Increasing cloudiness with showers and isolated thunderstorms this evening into tonight, lingering into Friday.
- → Behind the front rain chances are low, less than 20 percent, through the middle of next week.
- → Temperatures are near to below normal into the weekend with above normal temperatures Monday and Tuesday.





National Forecast - Today




A cold front approaches from the north and west with scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms arriving this evening and into the overnight.



Severe Wind Outlook


Today and Tonight



A few thunderstorms could become strong to severe, with damaging wind gusts as the primary severe hazard.




National Forecast - Friday



Showers and isolated thunderstorms come to an end from southwest to northeast.




National Forecast - Saturday



A cool and dry day expected behind the cold front.

Sun. Mon. Tue. Wed.


An extended period of dry conditions is expected, with warming temperatures through Tuesday. A dry cold front moves through on Tuesday with a reinforcing cold, dry air mass coming in for the middle of next week.






8-14 Day Outlook
