...NWS STORM SURVEY CONFIRMS THREE TORNADOES IN COLLETON COUNTY ON SUNDAY MORNING APRIL 15TH...

A TORNADO TOUCHED DOWN 1.5 MILES SOUTH OF ISLANDTON AROUND 938 AM AND TRAVELED NORTHEAST 1 MILE BEFORE LIFTING. THE TORNADO WAS UP TO 60 YARDS WIDE AND SNAPPED OFF OR UPROOTED HUNDREDS OF TRESS...DESTROYED A LARGE FRAMED BARN WITH DEBRIS SPREAD OVER A HALF MILE TO THE NORTHEAST. SEVERAL LARGE 2X4S AND 4X6S FROM THE BARN WERE PROJECTED INTO THE ROOF OF THE HOUSE. A LARGE OBJECT HIT THE HOUSE...BREAKING OUT THREE WINDOWS AND KNOCKING SOME OF THE BRICKS LOOSE. SIDING WAS ALSO TORN FROM THE HOUSE. THE RESIDENTS OF THE HOUSE FOUND REFUGE IN AN INTERIOR BATHROOM. THE RESIDENTS ALSO REPORTED THAT ALL WATER FROM THE TOILETS WAS SUCKED OUT. A LARGE 8000 POUND HORSE TRAILER WAS LIFTED UP AND CARRIED THROUGH THE AIR FOR ABOUT 500 FEET BEFORE BEING DEPOSITED INTO A LINE OF TREES. IN ADDITION...AN 800 POUND GRAIN WAGON WAS LIFTED UP AND CARRIED 400 FEET BEFORE LANDING ON THE GROUND. A BASS BOAT WAS FLIPPED OVER AND A 4 WHEELER WAS DAMAGED. OTHER TRACTORS AND FARM EQUIPMENT WERE DAMAGED. THIS TORNADO TOPPLED A TREE ONTO A MOBILE HOME...DAMAGING IT. FLYING DEBRIS SLIGHTLY INJURED TWO HORSES. THE TORNADO HAD MAXIMUM WIND SPEED ESTIMATED TO BE NEAR 110 MPH...WHICH PLACES IT AT THE UPPER END OF THE F1 CATEGORY USING THE ENHANCED FUJITA SCALE. HOWEVER...ONCE IT IS DETERMINED THE WIND SPEEDS NEEDED TO CARRY THE HORSE TRAILER AND THE GRAIN WAGON...IT IS POSSIBLE THAT THE WIND SPEED ESTIMATES AND THE EF SCALE RATING MAY BE RAISED.

THE SAME STORM PRODUCED A SECOND TORNADO THAT TOUCHED DOWN AROUND 941 AM NEAR ROUTE 63 ABOUT 1.5 MILES EAST SOUTHEAST OF ISLANDTON. THIS TORNADO TRAVELED NORTHEAST ABOUT 1/2 MILE AND CARRIED TWO EMPTY GRAIN SILOS ABOUT 100 FEET...SNAPPED OFF OR UPROOTED DOZENS OF TREES...DESTROYED A LARGE PORTION OF AN OUTBUILDING...AND SEVERELY INJURED A DOG. THIS TORNADO WAS ABOUT 30 YARDS WIDE AND HAD MAXIMUM WIND SPEEDS ESTIMATED TO BE 95 MPH. USING THE ENHANCED FUJITA SCALE...THIS PLACES THIS TORNADO IN THE F1 CATEGORY.

THE SAME STORM PRODUCED A THIRD TORNADO THAT INITIALLY TOUCHED DOWN NEAR 944 AM ABOUT 3 MILES SOUTH SOUTHWEST OF RUFFIN AND TRAVELED NORTHEAST ABOUT 2 MILES SPORADICALLY TOUCHING DOWN ALONG THE WAY. THIS TORNADO OVERTURNED 3 MOBILE HOMES...INJURING 9 PEOPLE...SHIFTED ANOTHER 7 MOBILES HOMES OFF THEIR FOUNDATION...TORE THE SKIRTING AWAY FROM ANOTHER MOBILE HOME...DESTROYED A STORAGE SHED WITH A GOOD PORTION OF IT LANDING 50 YARDS AWAY AND SNAPPED OFF OR UPROOTED DOZENS OF TREES. A COUPLE OF TREES FELL ON A HOUSE...DAMAGING IT. A VEHICLE AND AN OUTBUILDING WERE ALSO DAMAGED. ALL OF THE INJURIES WERE MINOR. THIS TORNADO WAS UP TO 80 YARDS WIDE AND HAD MAXIMUM WINDS ESTIMATED TO BE AROUND 100 MPH. USING THE ENHANCED FUJITA SCALE...THIS PLACES THIS TORNADO IN THE F1 CATEGORY.
