
# **Record Snowfall**

November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2006



### **Event Summary**

PUBLIC INFORMATION STATEMENT...FINAL SUMMARY NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE CHARLESTON SC 419 PM EST WED NOV 22 2006

...MAJOR COASTAL STORM IMPACTS THE SOUTHEAST COAST... ...EARLIEST MEASURABLE SNOWFALL RECORDED AT THE CHARLESTON AND SAVANNAH AIRPORTS... ...THUNDER SNOW REPORTED FOR THE FIRST TIME AT THE CHARLESTON AIRPORT... ...SNOWS OF 1-2 INCHES REPORTED WELL INLAND...

A MAJOR AND HIGHLY UNUSUAL COASTAL STORM DEVELOPED OFF THE SOUTHEAST COAST OF THE UNITED STATES MONDAY NIGHT INTO TUESDAY. THE STORM BROUGHT A VARIETY OF WEATHER AND IMPACTS TO THE REGION. BELOW IS A BRIEF SUMMARY OF THOSE IMPACTS.

....SNOW....

SLEET AND SNOW WAS OBSERVED ACROSS MUCH OF SOUTHERN SOUTH CAROLINA AND SOUTHEAST GEORGIA ON TUESDAY. THUNDER SNOW WAS REPORTED IN SOME AREAS...MAINLY AROUND THE CHARLESTON METRO AREA DURING THE MORNING HOURS. THUNDER SNOW IS A RARE EVENT NO MATTER WHERE IN THE UNITED STATES YOU ARE...AND IT HAS NEVER BEEN REPORTED AT THE CHARLESTON AIRPORT UNTIL YESTERDAY. SOME LOCATIONS IN THE CHARLESTON METRO AREA AS WELL AS SOUTHEAST SOUTH CAROLINA SAW A DUSTING OF SNOW...MAINLY ON ROOF TOPS AND GRASSY AREAS. HOWEVER SNOWS OF 1-2 INCHES WERE REPORTED IN THE FAR INTERIOR AREAS...MAINLY FROM JENKINS COUNTY GEORGIA EXTENDING NORTHEAST THROUGH NORTHERN COLLETON COUNTY SOUTH CAROLINA.

...SNOW RECORDS... THE CHARLESTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RECORDED A TRACE OF SNOWFALL ON TUESDAY WHICH ACCORDING TO NATIONAL CLIMATIC DATA CENTER RECORDS BACK TO 1930 IS THE EARLIEST WINTER SEASON CALENDAR DATE ON WHICH SNOW HAS BEEN REPORTED. PREVIOUSLY...THE EARLIEST WINTER SEASON DATE ON WHICH SNOW WAS RECORDED WAS NOVEMBER 25...WHEN A TRACE OF SNOWFALL WAS RECORDED ON THAT DATE IN 1950.

ONE NOTE IS THAT FROZEN PRECIPITATION WAS REPORTED AT CHARLESTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT IN THE FORM OF ICE PELLETS...COMMONLY KNOWN AS SLEET...ON NOVEMBER 5 1995...ALSO AMOUNTING TO A TRACE.

SAVANNAH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT RECORDED A TRACE OF SNOWFALL TUESDAY AFTERNOON WHICH ACCORDING TO NATIONAL CLIMATIC DATA CENTER RECORDS BACK TO 1950 IS THE EARLIEST WINTER SEASON CALENDAR DATE ON WHICH SNOW HAS BEEN REPORTED. PREVIOUSLY...THE EARLIEST WINTER SEASON DATE ON WHICH SNOW WAS RECORDED WAS NOVEMBER 24...WHEN A TRACE OF SNOWFALL WAS RECORDED ON THAT DATE IN 1950.

#### ...HIGH SURF/BEACH EROSION...

LARGE BACK SWELL GENERATED BY THE COASTAL STORM PRODUCED HIGH SURF ALONG THE BEACHES OF SOUTH COASTAL SOUTH CAROLINA AND NORTH COASTAL GEORGIA. MODERATE TO LOCALLY SEVERE BEACH EROSION WAS REPORTED IN AREAS...PARTICULARLY ALONG THE BEACHES OF SOUTH COASTAL SOUTH CAROLINA INCLUDING HUNTING ISLAND...FOLLY BEACH...ISLE OF PALMS...WILD DUNES AND SULLIVANS ISLAND.

#### ...WIND DAMAGE/POWER OUTAGES...

HIGH WINDS KNOCKED DOWN POWER LINES DURING THE DAY TUESDAY RESULTING IN A NUMBER OF POWER OUTAGES UP AND DOWN THE SOUTH CAROLINA COAST. POWER COMPANIES REPORTED OUTAGES LASTING FROM TENS OF MINUTES TO SEVERAL HOURS IN SOME COMMUNITIES. THERE HAVE NOT BEEN ANY REPORTS OF WIND DAMAGE OR POWER OUTAGES ACROSS SOUTHEAST GEORGIA.
