...STRONG GUSTY WINDS EXPECTED TO INCREASE OVERNIGHT...

A POTENT UPPER LEVEL STORM SYSTEM WILL PASS THROUGH THE REGION
OVERNIGHT. A TIGHT PRESSURE GRADIENT IS DEVELOPING ACROSS GEORGIA
AND SOUTH CAROLINA AS SURFACE LOW PRESSURE DEEPENS OFF THE NORTH
CAROLINA COAST. GUSTY SOUTHWEST TO WEST WINDS WERE DEVELOPING AT
MID EVENING WITH GUSTS OVER 30 MPH ALREADY REPORTED AT SEVERAL
REPORTING LOCATIONS AT 9 PM.

WINDY CONDITIONS WILL PERSIST OVERNIGHT WITH SPEEDS FROM 20 TO 30
MPH WITH GUSTS AROUND 40 MPH AT TIMES IN EXPOSED AREAS AND ELEVATED
SURFACES...SUCH AS BRIDGES.

SECURE LOOSE OBJECTS SUCH AS TRASH CANS AND LAWN CHAIRS. HIGH PROFILE
VEHICLES SHOULD BE ALERT FOR STRONG CROSS WINDS AND GUSTS ON BRIDGES.

THE STRONGEST WINDS SHOULD BEGIN TO SLOWLY SUBSIDE TUESDAY MORNING
IN SOUTH CAROLINA AND LATE TONIGHT IN PARTS OF INLAND SOUTHEAST
GEORGIA.

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
