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



THE DROWNING INCIDENT

- Occurred Saturday afternoon, June 11, 2016
- Involved 2 Females and 1 Male
 - 22 and 24 years old
- Wading across-not swimming
 - One female stepped in a hole and was swept into deeper water
 - Her friend and a bystander jumped in to save her
 - The two rescuers drowned
- Air Temperature was around 75F/24C
- Water Temperature was around 40F/4C
- N-NW Wind 25 35 mph/11-18 m/s






WHAT FACTORS LED TO THE DROWNING?

- Changes in the Water Levels
 - Easy to cross in the past at lower levels in the past 10 years
- Cold early season water temperatures
 - 40F/4C at time of Incident
 - 15-30 minutes loss of consciousness
- Equipment Placement and Lack of Equipment


