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## **Port of Corpus Christi Emergency Manager Danielle Hale Named as NOAA StormReady® Hero**

NOAA has awarded the StormReady® Community Hero to Danielle Hale, an emergency manager with the Port of Corpus Christi, Texas, for taking decisive actions that saved lives when Hurricane Harvey made landfall last August. Louis W. Uccellini, Ph.D., director of NOAA's National Weather Service, recognized Hale today at a ceremony at the Congressman Solomon Ortiz International Center in downtown Corpus Christi. The StormReady Community Hero award formally recognizes people within a StormReady community for exemplary leadership that saved lives during extreme weather events.

Harvey made landfall on August 25, 2017, just northeast of Corpus Christi as a Category 4 hurricane - with sustained winds greater than 130 mph. Hurricane force winds and storm surge 6-10 feet above ground level caused widespread damage along the mid-Texas coastline, including the Port of Corpus Christi.

Hale's actions helped protect her community during Harvey's landfall and helped them rebound quickly after the storm passed. She activated the community's emergency operations plan well in advance of the storm, remained in continuous communication with all port partners and employees, and closed the nation's 4<sup>th</sup> largest port, actions that allowed for the timely evacuation of nearly every vessel and all non-essential employees. After the storm, Hale ensured the safety and security of all essential port personal and facilities by assisting with search and rescue, damage assessments and restoration activities. Hale's actions allowed the port to reopen in a record six days, with no fatalities.

Hale tenaciously worked to protect her community while her own family was displaced when Harvey destroyed their home.

"Danielle's actions exemplify the hard work and dedication of all emergency managers. I am honored to present her with this award for her heroic actions that directly saved lives when Hurricane Harvey struck her community," Uccellini said. "The vital partnerships between the National Weather Service and emergency managers is a critical part of building a Weather-Ready Nation."

Hale is the seventh recipient of the StormReady Community Hero award since its inception in 2002, and the first award recipient for actions taken to save lives during a catastrophic hurricane landfall.
