



Tornado Drill

Wednesday, March 6, 2019 at 10:00 AM CST

On Wed Mar 6, 2019 at 10:00 AM CST, your local National Weather Service in Corpus Christi, will conduct a Tornado Drill so you can exercise your tornado safety plans.

When a tornado is sighted, the most important rule is to get inside, get down, cover up!

- Seek shelter in a small interior room on the lowest floor of your home or business such as a bathroom, closet, then get down low and cover your head.
- Leave your mobile home and take shelter in a nearby building. If no building is nearby, lie flat in a ditch or ravine.
- Never stay inside a car. Leave the car and lie flat in a ditch or a ravine. If a building is nearby, take shelter inside. Never try to outrun a tornado in your car.
- At school, follow plans and go to a designated shelter area, usually interior hallways on the lowest floor. Avoid auditoriums, gyms and cafeterias.
- If you are in open country, take cover on low, protected ground.

Tornado Drill Details:

On Wed March 6th, at 10:00 AM CST, we will send a test message across NOAA Weather Radio which will mark the start of the drill. Therefore you will want to ensure your NOAA Weather Radio is powered on, working, and has a fresh set of batteries. This EAS message will be sent in the form of a required weekly test (RWT), which we normally conduct every Wednesday. At that time, you should execute your predefined tornado sheltering procedures. *(caution, some of the Midland brand NOAA Weather Radio's do not sound an audible alarm for test messages)*
