## NWS in State College Volunteer Application Process

#### Prospective students should:

- Fill out the Student Volunteer Application

  - You can choose either or both offices on page 4.
- Please upload materials below via the Google Form
  - resume,
  - college transcript, and
  - cover letter describing motivation and interests.
- Well-qualified applicants will be interviewed before selection
- We generally limit selections to 1 to 3 students per academic semester
- If you volunteer for at least 135 hours of work (8-10 hours/week), you may qualify for 3 credits for your work. Typically, this requires a paper and/or presentation to be completed at the end of the study period. Talk to your advisor for more details.
