CARIBE WAVE 21


- CARIBE WAVE 21 was held successfully on March 11, 2021.
- Forty-seven of its forty-eight Member States and Territories participated, and a total of 333,515 people were directly engaged.



It was left up to the Member States and Territories to determine if any additional activity would be carried out and whether to use the simulated messages for one of the two scenarios: Jamaica and Northern Lesser Antilles.




- The questionnaire contained 27 questions for participating countries to provide feedback on the exercise.
- Available from the day of the exercise, March 19 through May 11.
- Responses from 97% of MS and territories. A total of 36 surveys were completed from forty-five of the forty-eight Member States and Territories.

• The PTWC issued the "dummy" (start of exercise) message on March 11, 2021 at 1400 UTC and disseminated over all its standard broadcast channels.




• As in past years, the most common methods to receive the Dummy message were the Email and Fax.


• The time at which the message was received by the TWFP/NTWC in the different systems.


Costa Rica: We received a Dummy Message from CATAC.


Colombia: Bulletin #3 was not received. The other bulletins were received within the times established in the CARIBE WAVE 21 exercise manual.

Guyana: The messages arrived within one minute of the scheduled time. Two Message 5 were received. The enhanced graphic products came in message 5 and not message 3.

Grenada: No email was received.



According to Member States and Territories, there are about 102 communities recognized for TsunamiReady® or Tsunami Ready.


Q17 Is your country implementing the Community Performance Based Tsunami Recognition Program (TsunamiReady® or Tsunami Ready)?

The results indicated that 87% of the countries are interested in implementing Tsunami Ready, with 342 as total number of target communities to be recognized.


Q18 Is your country interested in implementing the Community Performance Based Tsunami Recognition Program (TsunamiReady® or Tsunami Ready)?

Q25 Did the exercise planning go well?




Grenada: Overall the exercise went well, however, there were areas identified for improvement.

Jamaica: COVID-19 condition led to cancellations of local activities/exercise.

Saint Lucia: There was not much opportunity to engage a local community to have an evacuation exercise due to COVID-19 restriction.

Venezuela: Despite the restrictions imposed by the pandemic, the objectives and goals proposed for this exercise were achieved.


Status of Sea Level Stations during the exercise




- The PTWC provided simulated forecasted maximum wave heights for 50 CARIBE EWS stations in the simulated bulletins.
- Only about 60% of these sea level stations were online on the IOC Sea Level facility during the exercise period.

Status of DART's


All the 7 DART stations were not streaming data in the Caribbean/Gulf and Atlantic thru the National Buoy Center during the day of the exercise.

Social Media Reach




- The hashtag tracker Brand24 was used to monitor #CaribeWave21 from February 21 to March 17.
