Joint CARIBE WAVE and LANTEX 2015 Exercise in the Western Atlantic, Subject: Caribbean and Adjacent Regions on 25 March 2014

The Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Tsunami and Other Coastal Hazards Warning System for the Caribbean and Adjacent Regions at its eighth session (ICG/CARIBE EWS-VIII, Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago, 29 April-1 May 2013), decided to conduct exercises named CARIBE WAVE on an annual basis leaving each Member State to define its level of participation. The Ninth Session of the Intergovernmental Coordination Group for the Tsunami and other Coastal Hazards Warning System for the Caribbean and Adjacent Regions (ICG/CARIBE-EWS-IX), St Thomas, US Virgin Islands, 13-15 May 2014, recommended that that a joint Exercise Caribe Wave/Lantex 15 takes place on 25 March 2015, with two hypothetical scenarios: An earthquake located offshore eastern Panama, and a submarine landslide off the East coast of the United States of America:

- The Caribe Wave/Lantex 15 Caribbean tsunami scenario simulates a tsunami generated by a magnitude 8.5 earthquake with epicenter at 10.3°N, 78.8°W, just north of Panama in the southwest Caribbean Sea. Event origin time: 25 March 2015 at 14:00 UTC.
- The Lantex 15 Florida landslide Scenario simulates a magnitude M 6.8 earthquake off the east coast of Florida which triggers a large slump and tsunami. Event Origin Time: 25 March 2015 at 13:00 UTC.

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The initial dummy messages will be issued by the US Pacific Tsunami Warning Center (PTWC) and the US National Tsunami Warning Center (NTWC) on <u>25 March 2015 at 14:05 UTC (Universal Time Coordinated)</u> for the offshore eastern Panama scenario and at <u>13:02 UTC (Universal Time Coordinated)</u> for the Florida scenario. These messages will be disseminated through their standard broadcast channels. The dummy message is issued to test communications with Tsunami Warning Focal Points (TWFPs) and Emergency Management Organizations (EMOs), to start the exercise. It will be the only exercise message broadcast from the PTWC/NTWC, excluding special email messages which will be made available to the officially designated TWFP.

The ICG/CARIBE-EWS of UNESCO/IOC, the Caribbean Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA), the Coordination Centre for Prevention of Natural Disasters in Central America (CEPREDENAC), the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), and the U.S. National Tsunami Hazard Mitigation Program (NTHMP) are providing the framework for this exercise as a means for emergency responders throughout the Caribbean and Adjacent Regions to test and update tsunami response plans. High levels of vulnerability and threat in many Caribbean and North-western Atlantic nations should provide a strong incentive for local jurisdictions to prepare for a tsunami.

The attached Exercise Caribe Wave/Lantex 15, SW Caribbean Scenario, A Caribbean and Northwestern Tsunami Warning Exercise, 25 March 2015. Volume 1: Participant Handbook. IOC Technical Series, 118 vol.1, provides the framework for this exercise as a means for emergency responders throughout the Caribbean to test and update tsunami response plans. Detailed coordination for this exercise will be organized through national Tsunami Warning Focal Points (TWFPs) and Tsunami National Contacts (TNCs) who will decide on their level of participation.
