Summary: Only two stations in PR (American Samoa and Guam) were still using parachutes (and light sticks) as of March 2025. The new RS41 radiosonde, utilized by all PR upper air (UA) stations, is 61% lighter than previous radiosondes. Similar UA networks under NWS purview (Puerto Rico and the Caribbean Cooperative Hurricane Upper Air Station network) have not used parachutes or light sticks for several years. In alignment with guidance outlined in NWSI 10-1402, PRS 05-2003 can be rescinded.
