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# **Main Points**

- Cresting from Muscatine through Gregory Landing through Saturday.
- More rain is expected, possibly heavy, beginning Sunday afternoon into Wednesday.
  <u>\*\*\*This rain is NOT in the current forecast\*\*\*</u>
- The entire region remains very susceptible to additional river rises with heavy rains.
- The longer the rivers stay at high levels, the more chances there will be for the occurrence of heavy rains and then subsequent river rises.

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## **Current Warnings** New Tributary Flooding Expected



Mississippi River – ongoing Moderate to Major flooding \* Levels in the Dubuque area will fall below major flood stage tonight.

Current Total Forecast Rainfall: Sunday through Thursday Widespread 2" to 3"




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# Day 3 Rainfall Forecast



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#### Day 4 Rainfall Forecast (not included in today's river forecasts)




#### 7 am Monday through 7 am Tuesday

7 am Tuesday through 7 am Wednesday



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
# **Rainfall Impacts to River Levels**

- Potential Outcomes from the rain could be:
  - Less rain: the river continues to fall
  - Less widespread rain but localized higher amounts: slower fall, possibly brief leveling off of the river, or very minor rise
  - Current forecast rainfall (widespread 2"-3"): renewed rises below current crest levels
  - Higher rainfall: new crest near or above previous crests are possible

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# **Bottom Line for the Next Week**

- Quiet weather into Sunday.
- High confidence in rainfall occurring in the area Sunday afternoon through Wednesday night.
- Low confidence in rainfall amounts and location.
- Low confidence in the impact of the rainfall on the river levels.

 High river levels will persist through May. Each additional rain will prolong the high levels.

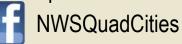
