

April 2016 Weather Summary

April brought a mixed bag of weather to the Borderland. April showers were present here and there along with some mountain snows. But April is the month noted for strong gusty westerly winds and blowing dust in the lowlands (see the wind rose at the end of this presentation) and this April did not disappoint with at least two days of significant blowing dust. One event on April 25 resulted in highway fatalities on Interstate 10 in Arizona which resulted in a closure of that highway into New Mexico just west of Lordsburg.

Temperature wise...April saw one day with record high temperatures in the Borderland with about 17 days having max temperatures above normal and 7 days below normal. So April behaved in a typical spring like pattern with big temperature swings. Precipitation overall was rather disappointing with only northern Luna, northern Dona Ana, eastern Otero, all of Sierra and eastern Grant counties receiving normal to above normal precipitation with the rest of the area getting less than 50% of normal precipitation. Thus Moderate drought conditions spread Eastward from Arizona into most of southern New Mexico. Abnormally dry conditions now exist in El Paso county. Hudspeth county has avoided the drought so far during April.
























How this works:


122 yrs of Marches



Mid-Apr IRI/CPC Model-Based Probabilistic ENSO Forecast





Current drought conditions for New Mexico and 3 month change

- Exceptional D4






Current drought conditions for Texas as of April 26, 2016







Daily temperature data for April 2016 in El Paso




Daily temperature/precipitation data for April in El Paso




Temperature and precipitation outlook for May 2016







Temperature and precipitation outlook for May – Jul 2016









April 2016 radar rainfall estimate with surface rainfall reports




April 2016 Radar Rainfall Estimate (Percent of normal)






