

November 2016 Weather Summary

November turned out to be a mild, quiet month overall, with excitement at the beginning and end of the month. Temperatures were above normal, but this was due mostly to warm lows. Average high temperatures were just a bit above normal, but average low temperatures were well above normal. In fact most places saw their first freezing temperatures about 2 to 3 weeks later than normal.

The excitement came in the form of severe weather at the beginning and winter weather (finally) at the end. On November 3rd an upper low moved over Arizona while at the surface, a cold front moved in from the east. This created an unstable airmass with strong flow aloft, all good ingredients for severe weather. Heavy rains fell across parts of the Gila Wilderness and Sierra County Lakes early on the morning of the 4th, while later that afternoon and evening the heavy rains spread further east over Dona Aña County and the El Paso metro area. Large hail accompanied the rain in many of these areas, and downtown El Paso and much of it's freeway system came to a standstill for a few late afternoon hours as hail plugged the drainage system, allowing flash flooding to occur.

Weather Summary (cont'd)

Most of the rest of November came and went without incident until the very end, when a strong upper low swept across northern New Mexico. This system brought cooler air in with it along with scattered showers. The mountains experienced their first significant snows of the season, with the Gila Wilderness receiving 1 to 2 inches and the Sacramento Mountains receiving 2 to 4 inches. And once the skies cleared, much of the area saw their coldest temperatures of the season on the last morning of the month.



















































ENSO Forecast from November through the end of summer of 2017

- > El Niño or La Niña Advisory: Issued when El Niño or La Niña conditions are observed and expected to continue.










Current drought conditions for Texas as of November 22, 2016










Daily temperature data for November 2016 in El Paso




Daily temperature/precipitation data YTD through November in El Paso




Temperature and precipitation outlook for December 2016







Temperature and precipitation outlook For Dec – Feb 2016









Temperature Outlook Through February 2018




Precipitation Outlook Through February 2018



Novmeber 2016 radar rainfall estimate with surface rainfall reports




November 2016 radar rainfall estimate percent of normal




Average Daily Mean Temperature for NOVEMBER 2016

Average Daily Mean Temperature: November 2016




Total Precipitation for NOVEMBER 2016
