
Weather Highlights

- ☐ Isolated showers and storms possible between 2-10PM today.




Weather Map/Pattern: Tonight & Tomorrow (Fri.)

- ☐ Isolated showers and storms remain a possibility on Friday afternoon.







Potential Rainfall (through Thursday 9/25)


7-day Total Rainfall Prediction

- **□** NOTE: this does NOT capture areas of heavier rain that could occur with any thunderstorms.





High Temperatures: Friday and Saturday







High Temperatures: Sunday and Monday







Low Temperatures: Tonight and Tomorrow Night





Low Temperatures: Saturday Night and Sunday Night






Tropical Update (Sept 18th-24th)

No Impacts for next 7 days


- Tropical Storm Gabrielle is expected to curve out to sea, well away from the **United States**



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



