

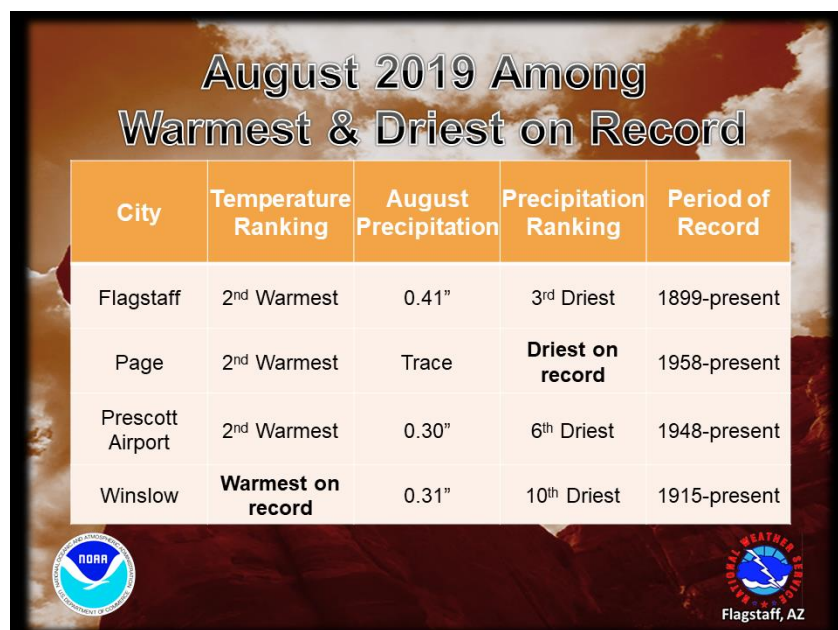
MONTH IN REVIEW FOR NORTHERN ARIZONA FOR AUGUST 2019

. . . AUGUST TEMPERATURE AND PRECIPITATION OVERVIEW . . .

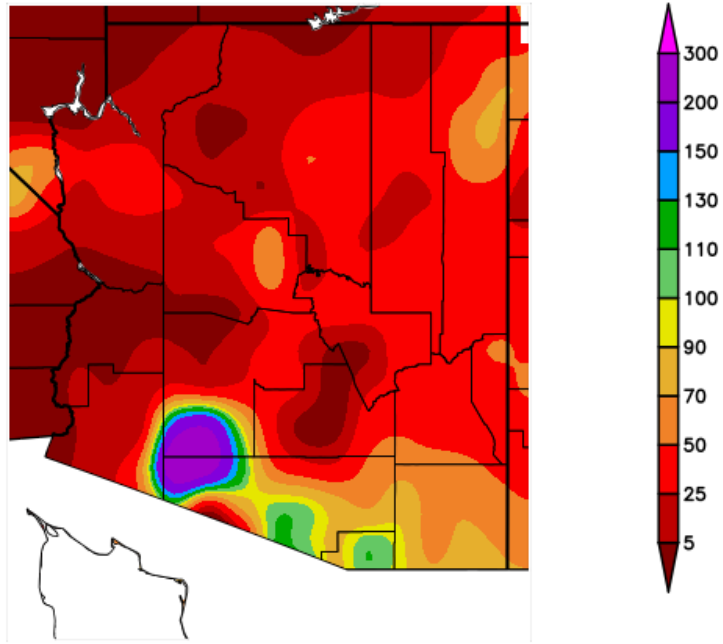
August 2019 was one of the hottest and driest on record for much of northern and central Arizona. Monsoon rainfall was far below normal, with long breaks of hot, dry weather between brief stormy periods. Daytime temperatures were much above normal with many daily records set.
