The highest rainfall totals were observed over the southeast slopes of the Big Island in the Ka'ū District with several locations receiving over 30 inches. The high rainfall amounts occurred in a short time, and as an unfortunate result, massive flood waves surged through Nā'ālehu and Pāhala, effectively cutting off the towns, sweeping homes off of their foundations, and destroying bridges, roads, and other vital infrastructure. Two direct fatalities were reported in Naalehu as a result of the floodwaters. Many other valuable community assets, such as schools and the Naalehu cemetery, were damaged. Wind damage occurred across many parts of the county, with numerous road closures due to down trees, utility poles, and power lines, across northern, eastern, and southern sections of the county. There were widespread power outages with 58,000 customers without power. By the following Friday, over 11,000 customers remained without power.

There were several reports of roof damage across Honolulu (Punchbowl, 'Aiea, Kapahulu, 'Āina Haina, Kaimukī, Kalihi, Makiki). A large tree fell on a home in Kalihi and several vehicles were damaged by downed trees in Waikiki. Several roads were also closed due to downed trees. At one point over 110,000 were without electricity across both windward and leeward O'ahu. Flood waters blocked many roads, including the H1 freeway. Police rescued 12 people from four homes who were trapped due to flooding.

Kūhiō Highway closed near Hā'ena Beach Park and near Wainiha due to flooding. Maluhia Road (Tree Tunnel) was closed due to fallen trees. Over 36,000 customers were without power.

Multiple roads were closed due to flooding, including near Kihei and Makawao. Hāna Highway was also closed between Hāna and Kīpahulu due to flooding. Fallen trees blocked roads and damaged cars. Over 28,000 were without power across the islands of Maui, Lana'i and Moloka'i. Within Haleakalā National Park,

multiple trees were blown down, blocking the only access road to the park. Haleakalā Summit District experienced major damage to facilities in the headquarters area at 7,000 feet and to facilities above 8,500 feet elevation.
