Chambers County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in Chambers County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. Rainfall totals of 1-4" were recorded.			

Galveston County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in Galveston County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. Rainfall totals of less than 1" were recorded.			

Harris County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in Harris County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. The majority of the rainfall that occurred happened when the remnant moisture from Edouard brought isolated thunderstorms on 9/3/2026 which produced isolated rainfall totals of 2-4".			

Houston County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in Houston County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. Most of the county received 2-4" of rainfall with locally higher amounts in the northeastern portion of the county of 5-8".			

Liberty County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Tropical Storm Edouard produced a swath of 4-8" of rainfall across the northern half of the county with isolated amounts of 12-16" along the border with Hardin County. Had a few reports of water over road ways and stalled vehicles along TX-105 from Cleveland to the Hardin County line. A river gauge on a tributary of the Trinity River, Menard Creek near Rye, crested at 28.06ft (Major Stage).			

Montgomery County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in Montgomery County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. Most of the county received 1-3" of rainfall with locally higher amounts in the eastern portion of the county of 4-6".			

Polk County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Tropical Storm Edouard brought at least 4-8" of rainfall across Polk County with a swath of 8-16" from the southern portion of the county through the center of the county. There were multiple reports of flooded roads across the county. A 55 MPH wind gust was recorded near Lake Livingston as the center then Tropical Depression Edouard moved overhead, and these high winds caused downed trees near the lake. A river gauge on a tributary of the Trinity River, Long King Creek at Livingston, crested at 23.7.ft (Minor Stage). Polk County Judge issued a Local Declaration of Disaster due to the impacts in the County caused by Tropical Storm Edouard.			

San Jacinto County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in San Jacinto County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. Rainfall totals of 2-6" were recorded.			

Trinity County	Injuries: Unknown	Fatalities: 0 direct	Evacuations: 0
Little to no impacts were seen in Trinity County associated with Tropical Storm Edouard. Most of the county received 3-6" of rainfall with locally higher amounts in the center and northeastern portion of the county of 6-10".
