	The last part of the month again had a significant enough frontal passage to bring winter storms to the higher elevations of Interior Central California. Snow amounts included 29 inches at Kibby Ridge and Tunnel Guard Station; 24" at Mammoth Mountain; 23" at Upper Burnt Corral; and 18" at Farewell Gap in the Southern Sierra. In the Kern Mountains 8" of new snow fell at Alpine Forest
