California Highway Patrol reported standing water covering the intersection of State Route 155 and Famoso-Porterville Road.

An upper level low pressure system dropped southward along the California coast on October 2 spreading precipitation across the Central California Interior. Most of the San Joaquin Valley received a few hundredths of an inch of rainfall while the Southern Sierra Nevada picked up a few tenths of an inch with some locally higher amounts. The low slowly tracked toward the Southern California coast on October 3 which provided for enough instability for scattered thunderstorms to break out over the area during the afternoon. The thunderstorms produced moderate to heavy rainfall across portions of the San Joaquin Valley and Southern Sierra Nevada. There were numerous reports of flooding during the afternoon and evening of October 3 and Flash Flooding was reported near Kettleman City and Huron along the west side of the San Joaquin Valley. A Flash Flood Emergency was issued for the Ferguson Fire burn scar where there several reports of debris flows and roads being washed out. There were several reports of one to two inches of rainfall in the San Joaquin Valley and Southern Sierra Nevada from the October 3 thunderstorms. With a warm airmass prevailing over the area, snow levels were above 11000 feet and snowfall was confined to the higher peaks in the Southern Sierra Nevada. The low moved east of the region on October 4 bringing an end to the precipitation.

An upper level low pressure system pushed into the Pacific Northwest on October 5 then dropped southeast into the Great Basin on October 6 providing the Kern County Mountains and Deserts with a period of strong winds during the afternoon and evening hours as a cold front associated with this system pushed through central California. Several reporting stations had wind gusts exceeding 45 mph, and a few low impact indicator sites had gusts around 60 mph. In addition, scattered showers brought some precipitation to the mountains and Kern County Deserts with the several locations in the Southern Sierra Nevada picking up a few tenths of an inch of rainfall while the Kern County Mountains and Deserts generally picked up a few hundredths of an inch of rainfall. Breezy conditions prevailed on the west side of the San Joaquin Valley during the morning of October 7 where several stations measured gusts around 40 mph. The winds diminished by the afternoon of October 7 as the low moved into the Desert Southwest region.

A low pressure system moved into southern California on October 13 and moved slowly inland on October 14. While the precipitation with this system mainly stayed to the south of our area, it interacted with an upper ridge that was building into the Pacific Northwest to produce a strong offshore gradient over central California which resulted in a brief period of strong mono-type northeast winds over the Southern Sierra Nevada during the late evening of October 14 and the early morning of October 15. Several dead trees were blown down near North Fork and Bass Lake in Madera County resulting in some brief road closures and some damage to a few structures.

A dry upper trough pushed through California on October 29. This system brought a noticeable cooling trend to the area with diurnal temperatures lowering by several degrees from the previous day and a period of strong winds along the west side of the San Joaquin Valley where there were several gusts between 30 and 40 mph and over the higher elevations of Kern County where a few locations had peak gusts around 50 mph. The wind slowly diminished on October 30 as the through moved to the east of the area.

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
