
# **June 2021 Climate Summary**

#### June Precipitation Highlights:

- Monthly rainfall was well above normal over large portions of central IL, but ranged from over 2" below normal in the southeast to several inches above normal in a few areas. A few significant weather events occurred:
  - June 18-19: Severe thunderstorms produced wind damage from 70 to 90 mph winds in portions of Knox and Fulton Counties, as well as a 10 mile long EF-1 tornado path in southern Knox County. Numerous reports of 2" to 4" rainfall were reported, with a highest report of 6.47" near Paris.
  - June 24-27: A pattern supporting repeated periods of thunderstorms set up June 24<sup>th</sup> and continued until near the end of the month. Daily rainfall was reported across much of the area, with some areas of very heavy rainfall especially June 24-27. Rainfall amounts from 2" to 5" were common, with as much as 10.57" reported near Bloomington. Significant flooding occurred from just north of Lincoln into Bloomington-Normal. I-55 near McLean was closed due to damage to the roadway by floodwaters, and record creek levels were observed on Kickapoo Creek. Other roadways in the area suffered closures due to the flooding as well. Several brief EF-0 and EF-Unknown tornadoes occurred June 25-26, affecting Champaign, Macon, Piatt, McLean, and Logan Counties.

#### July Look Ahead:

· Official outlooks from NOAA's Climate Predication center show near to above normal temperatures favored for the area. Near normal rainfall is favored in central IL and trending toward above normal rainfall in southeast IL.
