## CARIBE WAVE 22 Summary

- CARIBE WAVE 22 was held on March 10, 2022. Over 406,000 people registered their participation in the Tsunami Zone website.
- PTWC sent a Dummy Message and simulated tsunami threat products to the TWFPs and NTWCs.
- The Sea Level data was monitored during the exercise. According to an analysis by ITIC-CAR, 32 of the 52 regional stations listed in the PTWC simulated products were operational.
- Social media platforms were a primary source for communicating tsunami awareness, reaching over 1.2 million people worldwide.


