



# Lake Effect Snow Showers

March 18, 2023  
4:00 PM

Winter Weather Advisory Remains in Effect into early Sunday Morning for southern Lower MI

## Key Messages

- Lake effect snow showers will continue through the night. The strongest bands will also shift south into SW MI and northern IN tonight.
- **Additional** accumulations of 1 to 4 inches are expected across southern Lower Michigan.
- There remains some uncertainty as to how far south the strongest lake effect bands will develop.
- Slick roads remain possible. Reduced visibilities are also expected due to gusty winds to 35-40 mph.

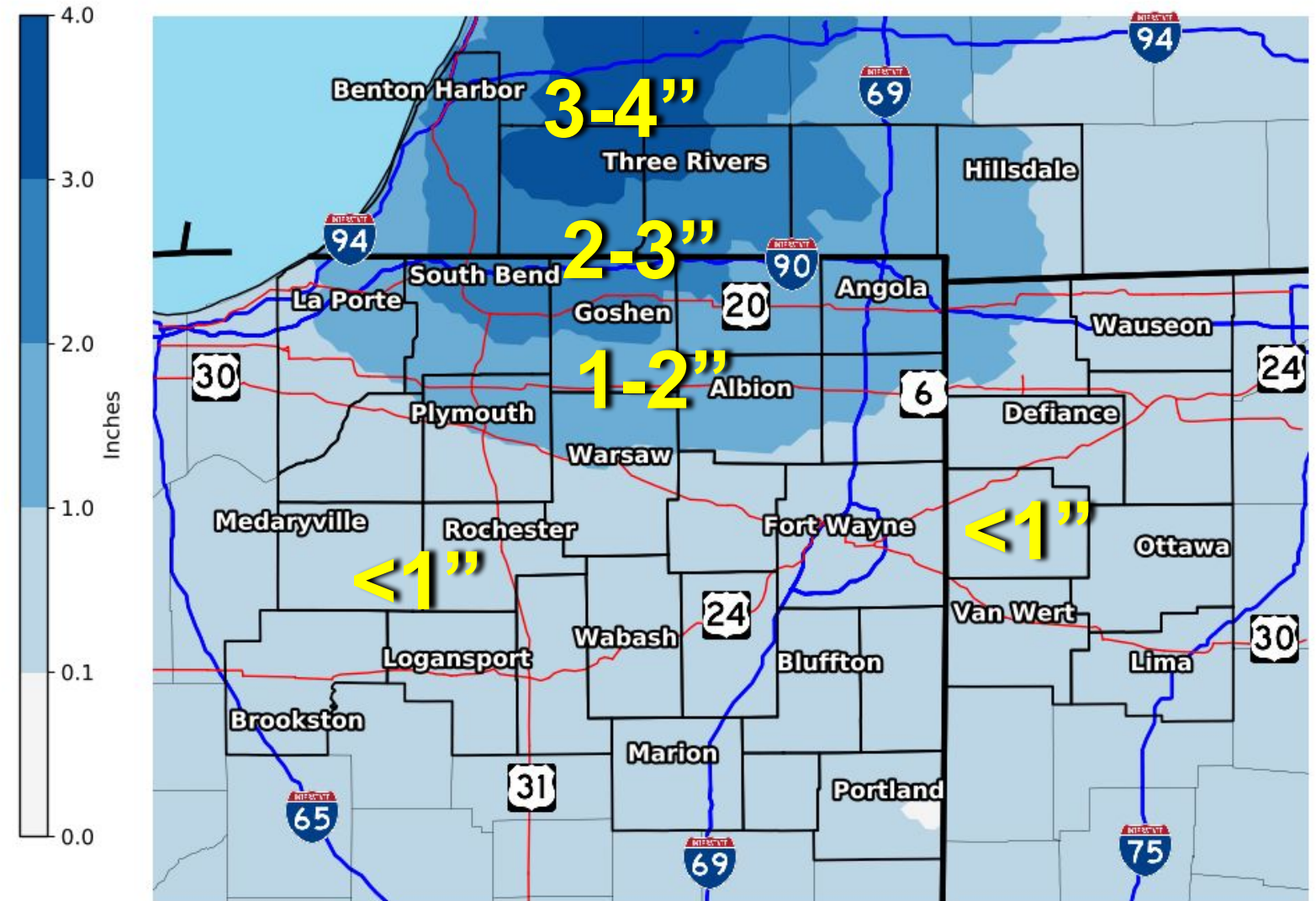

## Advisory Details



Until 5 AM EDT Sunday morning

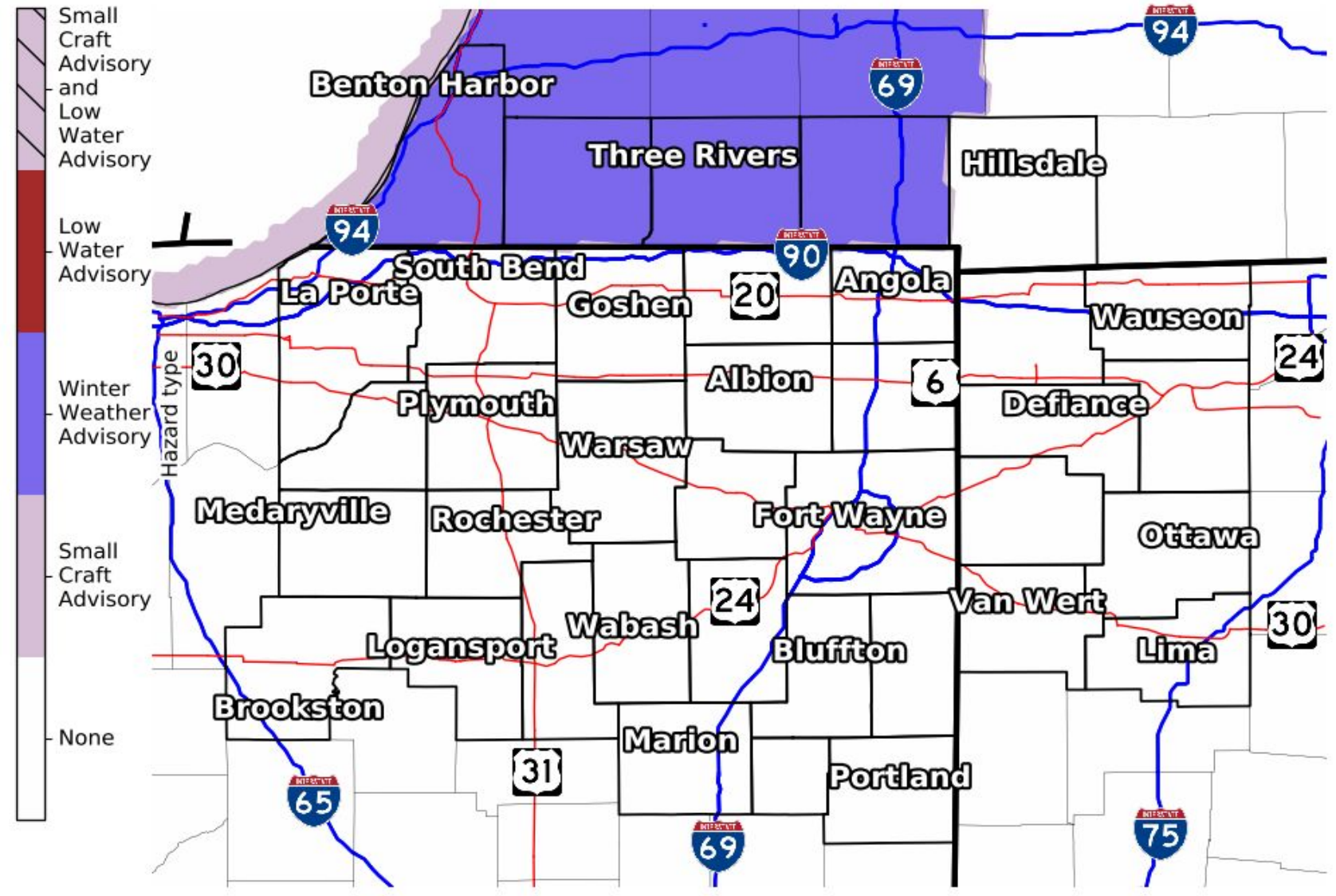


Areas of slippery travel due to snow, reductions in visibility due to lake effect snow and patchy blowing snow

## Forecast Details

- Lake effect snow showers increase and shift south this evening
- Highest snowfall rates are expected **8PM-2AM EDT**
- Visibilities less than 1/2 mile in stronger lake effect snow bands
- Winds from the west gusting up to 35-40 mph will cause areas of blowing snow
- **Confidence** remains low regarding exact snow amounts and areas of greatest impact
