Thunderstorm Coverage Increases this Afternoon

- A Few Strong to Severe Storms Possible through the Early Evening Hours
- **Primary Storm Hazards:** Gusty Winds of 40-60 mph and Frequent Lightning
- **Localized Flooding** Possible for Urban Locations Along the I-95 Corridor
- Storm Motion this Afternoon: Northeastward at 15-20 mph



Scattered to Numerous Afternoon and Early Evening T'Storms on Sunday and Monday

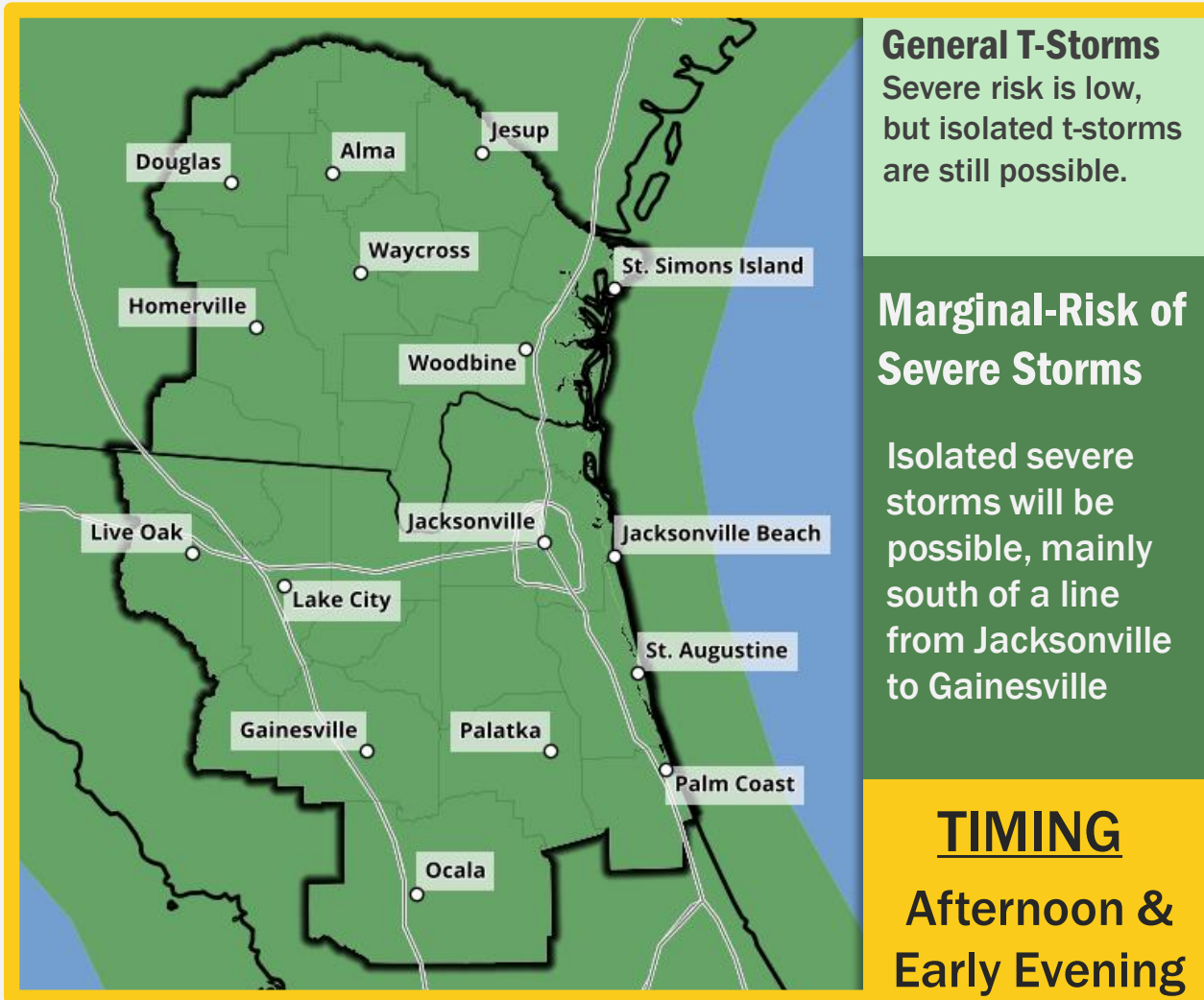


Widely Scattered Afternoon and Evening T'Storms Tues and Wed
