Northeast Florida & Southeast Georgia



Coastal / Tidal Flooding Continues this Weekend and into Next Week

- Today & Tonight: Minor Flooding along St. Johns River Basin around High Tides
- Friday into Weekend: Minor Flooding Expected, **Moderate Possible** St. Johns River Basin



Moderate Rip Current Risk at Area Beaches through Friday

- **High Risk for Northeast FL Beaches by the weekend**



Inland Late Night & Early Morning Fog through Saturday Morning



Daily Very Isolated Afternoon Thunderstorm Potential

Isolated Thunderstorm Potential this Afternoon



When thunder roars, go indoors!

Key Messages



- A few thunderstorms are possible this afternoon across portions of inland NE Florida, roughly between the St. Johns River basin west to the I-75 corridor.

Hazards

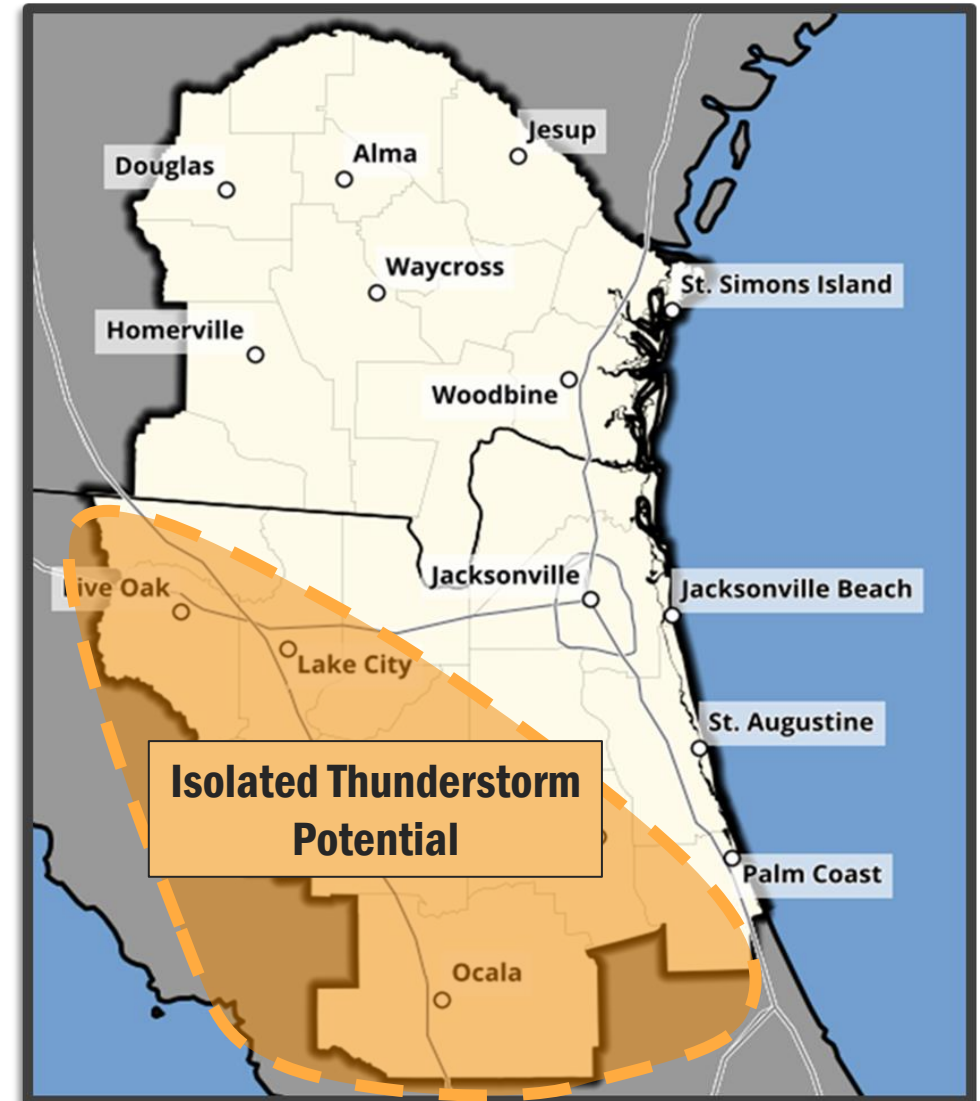


- Localized, brief heavy rain
- Briefly gusty winds near 40 mph possible
- Frequent lightning strikes

- 2 pm - 7 pm

Tidal Flooding Continues into Next Week



Key Messages

- Minor Flooding within St. Johns River Basin through tonight
- Minor Flooding for local Atlantic Coast begins Friday
- **Moderate Tidal flooding for St. Johns Basin begins Friday**
- Impacts include: tidal flooding of low-lying areas that includes docks, boat ramps, parking lots and some roads



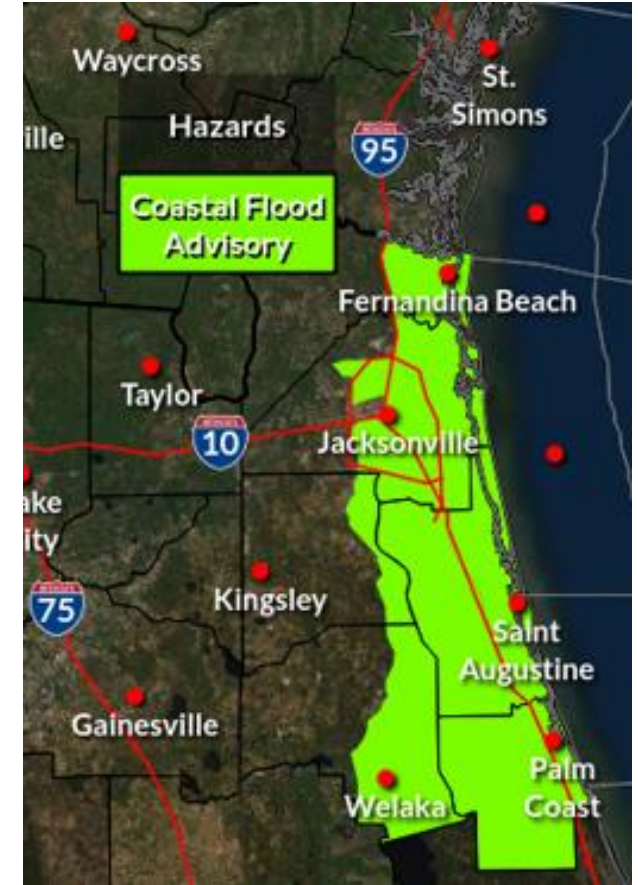
Actions

- Never venture into floodwaters – find an alternate route
- Secure vulnerable property



Timing

- Around times of high tide through early next week



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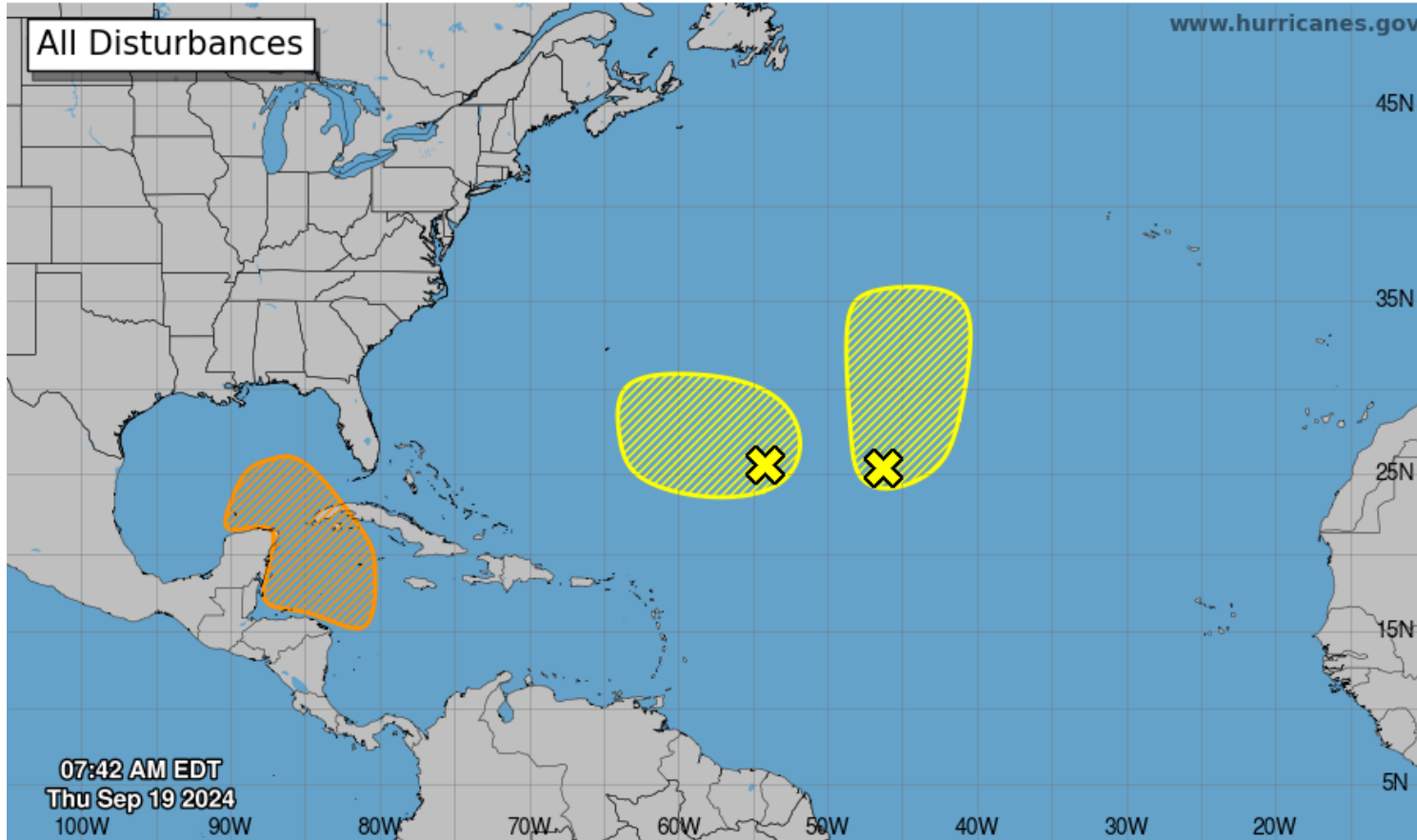
Tropical Weather Outlook

Current Info



An area of low pressure may develop early next week over the northwestern Caribbean Sea. This system could move slowly northward towards the Gulf of Mexico as it organizes into a potential tropical cyclone during mid to late next week.

Potential Local Impacts

- ✓ None through the middle portions of next week

- ✓ Know Family Emergency Plan
- ✓ Know your evacuation Zone
