- Inland Late Night & Early Morning Fog through Saturday Morning
- Daily Very Isolated Afternoon Thunderstorm Potential

### **Key Messages**

- → Minor Flooding within St. Johns River Basin through tonight
- → Minor Flooding for local Atlantic Coast begins Friday
- → Moderate Tidal flooding for St. Johns Basin begins Friday
- → Impacts include: tidal flooding of low-lying areas that includes docks, boat ramps, parking lots and some roads



#### **Actions**

- → Never venture into floodwaters find an alternate route
- → Secure vulnerable property



### **Timing**

→ Around times of high tide through early next week






