Northeast Florida & Southeast Georgia



Severe Thunderstorm Potential on Thursday

- Hazards: Damaging Wind Gusts & Isolated Tornadoes
- Timing: Morning Hours for Western Counties, Exiting Atlantic Coastal Counties by Sunset
- Localized Flood Potential, especially for Urban & Normally Flood Prone Locations
- Non-Thunderstorm Wind Gusts of 30-40 mph Could Cause Minor Wind Damage



Small Craft Advisories Wednesday Night through Thursday Night

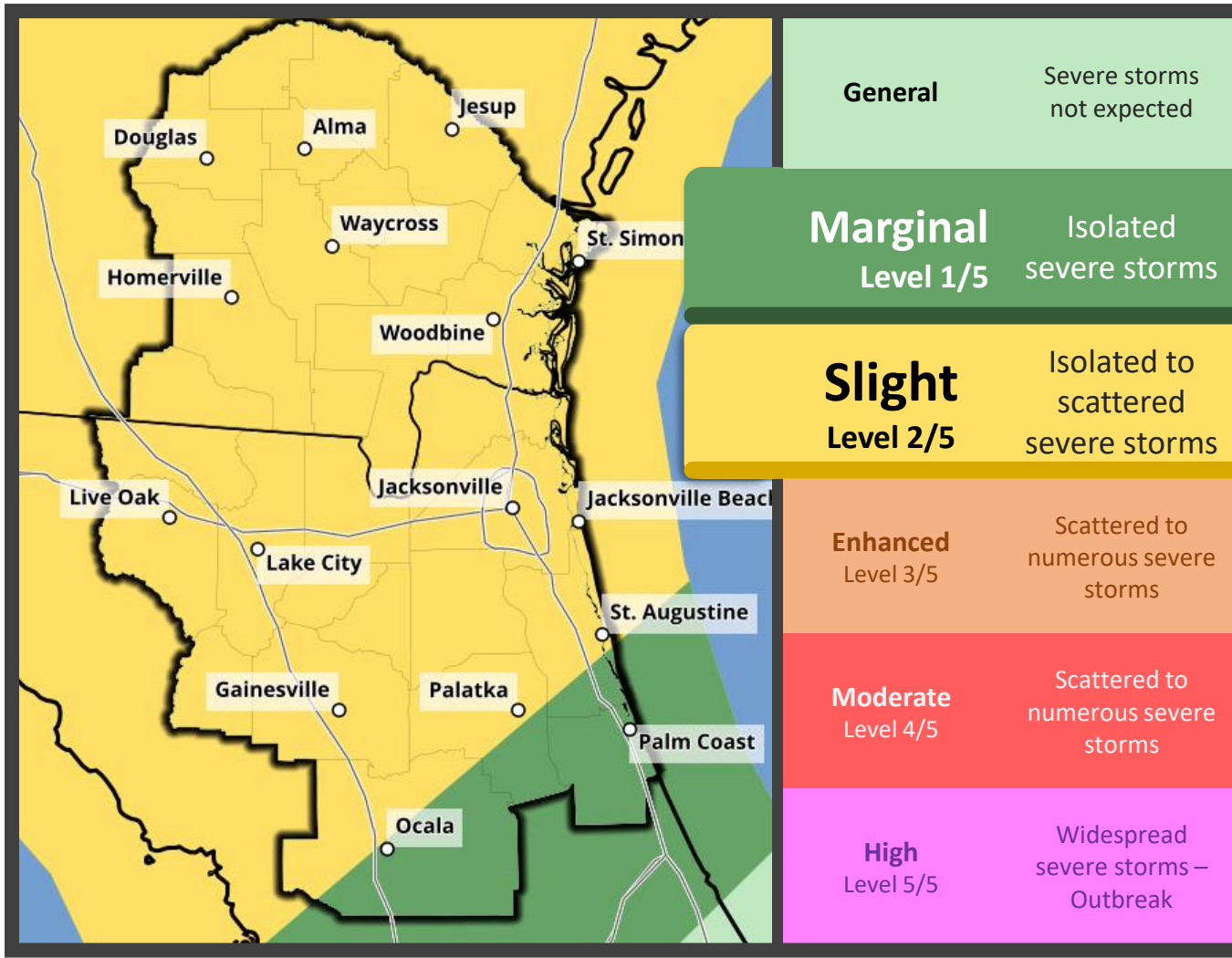


Moderate Rip Current Risk Today, High Risk on Wed and Thurs
