TUESDAY, JANUARY 29, 1957

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA AND VICINITY, early morning fog lifting with partial clearing, followed by showers this afternoon and tonight, highest about 60°, lowest tonight 36°; Wednesday cloudy, windy and colder.

MARYLAND, fog, drizzle and rain this morning, mostly cloudy and milder this afternoon with showers, high temperatures mostly in the 50's; showers tonight in most sections, but showers changing to snow flurries west of Cumberland, low temperatures 36° to 45°, except 30° to 36° in the west portion; Wednesday partly cloudy and cold with snow flurries in the extreme west portion.

VIRGINIA, early morning fog lifting with showers and warmer this afternoon, highest in the 60's today; showers and mild tonight, lowest in the 40's; Wednesday partial clearing, windy and colder.

DELAWARE, fog, drizzle and rain this morning, mostly cloudy and milder this afternoon with showers, high temperatures in the 50's; showers tonight with low temperatures 38° to 42°; Wednesday partly cloudy and colder.

THE MAPS shown here are prepared from observations taken daily at hundreds of stations throughout North America. The observations taken at 1:30 a. m. E. S. T., at approximately two hundred selected stations are inscribed on the large surface map of the United States, southern Canada, northern Mexico, and Cuba.

A complete explanation of these maps (including all symbols and tables) is printed frequently on the reverse side. Periodically, during each month, climatological charts and graphs appear in place of the Explanation; and, occasionally, illustrated articles of special meteorological interest are published.
