



Special Weather Update


A heavy rain/flooding event is expected to start Tuesday afternoon and last through Thursday or Friday. There is also a small threat for severe storms.













Tuesday Rainfall Forecast


The rain will begin in earnest in the afternoon, and continue into the evening. The heaviest rain will be seen in southeast Texas and western Louisiana with over two inches expected.













Wednesday Rainfall Forecast


Wednesday will likely see two periods of heavy rain, one in the early morning and another in the afternoon and evening. The heaviest rain will again be in southeast Texas and western Louisiana, with 2-4 inches expected.













Thursday Rainfall Forecast


Thursday is also expected to bring heavy rains, with 2-3 inches forecast across much of our forecast area.













Rain will be higher to the east and less in the west, but overall totals for the

day is less than one inch.


Friday Rainfall Forecast














Saturday Rainfall Forecast


Rain will be even less on Saturday, ranging from a tenth of an inch to a quarter of an inch.













Sunday looks to be drier, with most places seeing less than a tenth of an inch of rain.











Worse Case Scenario River Forecast


Pink indicates a major flood, red is moderate, and orange is minor flood.












Severe Weather Threat Tuesday

There is a small severe storm threat Tuesday afternoon and Tuesday night.


Mainly in western LA and southeast TX.














Severe Weather Threat Wednesday

Wednesday, with the morning and afternoon hours having the higher threat.













Wind Forecast Tuesday and Wednesday






A wind advisory will likely be required both Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon.












Sabine Pass Tides




Tides approach coastal flood warning criteria (4 ft) on Wednesday morning.











Calcasieu Pass Tides




Tides approach coastal flood warning criteria (4 ft) on Wednesday morning.











Freshwater Canal Tides




Tides approach coastal flood advisory criteria (3.5 ft) on Thursday and Friday mornings during high tide.












Amerada Pass Tides




Tides should stay below coastal flood advisory criteria (3.5 ft). The highest tides will occur Wednesday afternoon into Thursday morning.











Weather Summary


 Heavy rains are expected Tuesday through Thursday across the forecast area. Rain totals of 5 to 10 inches is expected, with locally higher amounts possible. A flash flood watch is in effect for southeast Texas and southwest Louisiana, and could be expanded east if conditions warrant.

• There is potential for area river to flood later this week and weekend, and they could reach moderate to major flood levels, depending on the exact location of the heaviest rains.









Weather Summary

Strong southeast winds of 20 to 25 mph, with gusts of 30 to 40 mph, are expected
 Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon. A wind advisory will likely be required both days.

 There is a small severe weather threat, both for Tuesday afternoon and evening, as well as Wednesday morning and afternoon. Damaging winds and tornadoes will be possible.

• Due to the strong onshore flow, tides will run above normal this week. A coastal flood advisory or warning will likely be issued. Expect minor coastal flooding during times of high tides Tuesday through Thursday.
