- E. BEACH EROSION...ABOUT 6 INCHES OF SAND REMOVED FROM BEACHES ALL THE WAY TO THE DUNES.
- F. FLOODING...ALONG COAST, OLD WASHOVER CHANNELS CARRIED WATER ACROSS ISLAND IN MANY PLACES.

CONSIDERABLE INLAND URBAN AND STREAM FLOODING. CITIES HARDEST HIT WERE RAYMONDVILLE IN WILLACY COUNTY...SOME 40 MILES NORTH NORTHWEST OF BROWNSVILLE...AND RIO GRANDE CITY...SOME 85 MILES WEST NORTHWEST OF BROWNSVILLE. OVER 100 HOMES AND BUSINESSES HAD WATER IN THEM IN RAYMONDVILLE...BUT DAMAGE WILL BE MAINLY TO FLOORING AND LOWER INSIDE WALLS. FEW EVACUATIONS TO CENTERS...WITH MANY PEOPLE STAYING WITH FRIENDS OR RELATIVES. RAYMONDVILLE IS IN SOMEWHAT OF A NATURAL BOWL ...WITH A LONG HISTORY OF FLOODING. ESTIMATED 250 HOMES FLOODED IN RIO GRANDE CITY...MOST IN A NEW SUBDIVISION EAST OF TOWN. THIS SUB-

DIVISION WAS ALSO BUILT IN A NATURAL BOWL AND THE DEVELOPER PROVIDED NO DRAINAGE SYSTEM. THE COUNTY PLANS TO SUE. AGAIN DAMAGE MAINLY RESTRICTED TO FLOORING AND LOWER WALL DAMAGE AND SOME FURNITURE. ONLY 2 FAMILIES USED EMERGENCY SHELTERS. FEW OTHER SIGNIFICANT REPORTS OF URBAN FLOODING RECEIVED.

- G. TORNADOES...NONE
- H. STORM EFFECTS...MANY GRAIN SORGHUM FIELDS WERE CONTINOUSLY WET FROM LATE FRIDAY THROUGH MONDAY. AS A RESULT...THE GRAIN SPROUTED IN THE HEADS IN MANY FIELDS. THIS WILL SUBSTANTIALLY REDUCE YIELDS AND ESPECIALLY PRICES. STILL TOO EARLY TO TELL ABOUT COTTON CROP LOSSES. THERE WILL BE SOME LOSS OF STANDS WERE FIELDS REMAIN FLOODED FOR MORE THAN JUST A FEW DAYS. TOTAL LOSS WILL BE IN THE MILLIONS...BUT MOST OF THAT WILL BE AGRICULTURAL.
