MAJOR FLOODING ALSO IN SOUTH BALDWIN COUNTY WHERE THE FISH RIVER ROSE TO ONE OF ITS HIGHEST LEVELS EVER. THE RIVER PEAKED AT 22.8 FEET ON 7/20/97. ALSO HAD MAJOR FLOODING IN CHOCTAW COUNTY WHERE STREAMS OVERFLOWED AND MANY ROADS WERE WASHED OUT.

H. STORM EFFECTS...

MOBILE COUNTY...EARLY ESTIMATES OF 20 MILLION IN DAMAGE. MOST DAMAGE FROM FLOODING. TREES AND POWER LINES WERE BLOWN DOWN. MOST OF THE DAMAGE TO HOMES WAS FROM DAMAGED ROOFS OR EXCESS WATER UNDERMINING THE FOUNDATION.

BALDWIN COUNTY...EARLY ESTIMATES OF 20 MILLION IN DAMAGE. DAMAGE WAS SIMILAR TO MOBILE COUNTY. THE COMMUNITY OF FAIRHOPE SEEMED TO HAVE MORE TREES DOWNED THAN OTHER AREAS.

2 DEATHS ON FRIDAY 7/19/97 1 - SAILBOAT WAS SWAMPED BY HIGH WAVES SOUTH OF GULF SHORES. BODY WAS FOUND IN SURF. 1 - ELDERLY MALE DIED OF A HEART ATTACK WHILE SECURING HIS BOAT FROM THE STORM.
