## Flood Watch in Effect Through Saturday Evening

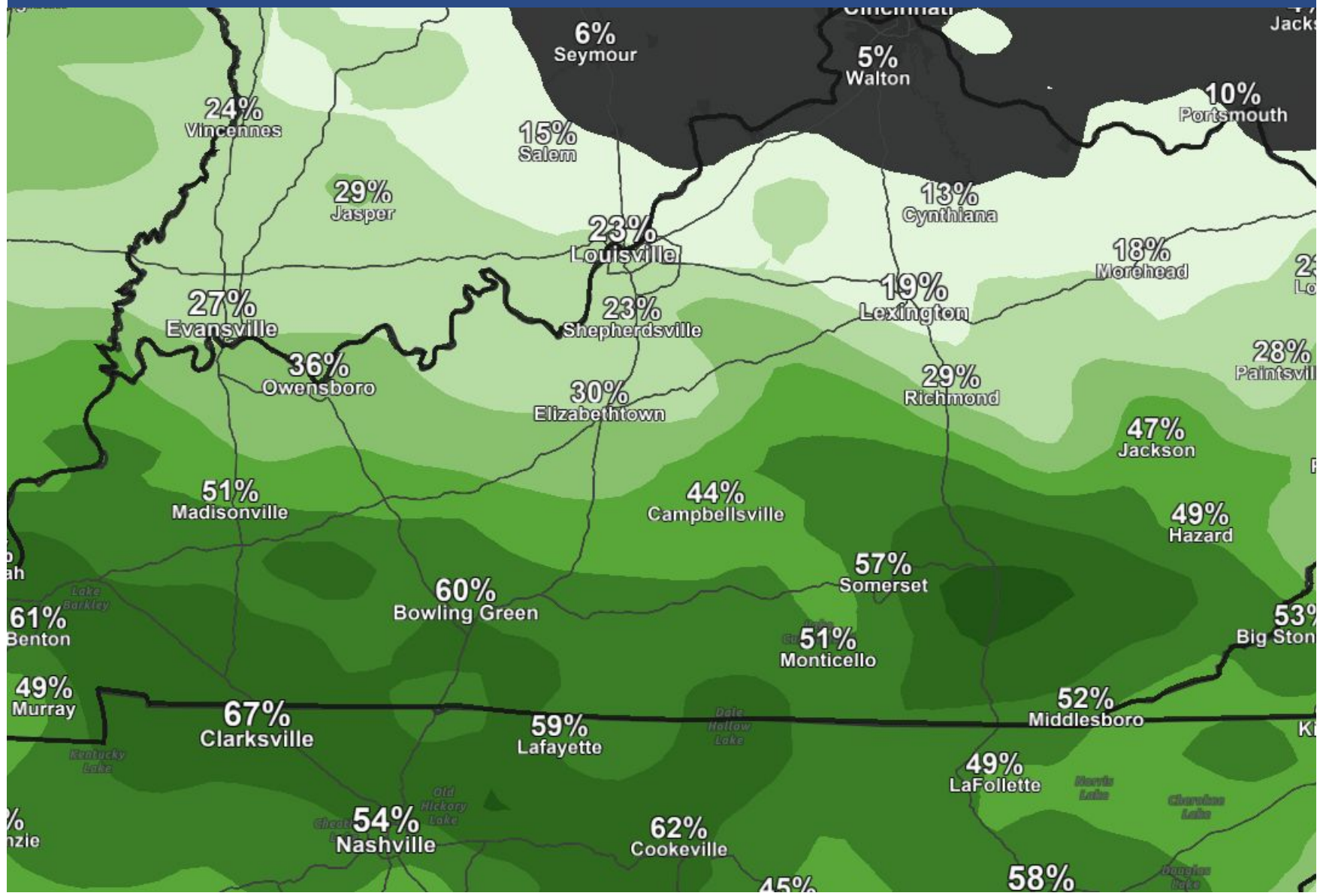
### Summary:

- ◆ Flood Watch in Effect until late Saturday night
- ◆ Additional waves of thunderstorms and heavy rain Friday night into Saturday morning continue the risk for flash flooding
- ◆ Widespread 0.5-2" of rainfall with localized pockets of 3-4"+ could lead to some places experiencing significant flash flooding
- ◆ Some thunderstorms could be strong with gusty locally damaging winds tonight and Saturday

- ◆ By 6am Saturday

## Another Wave of Thunderstorms and Heavy Rainfall

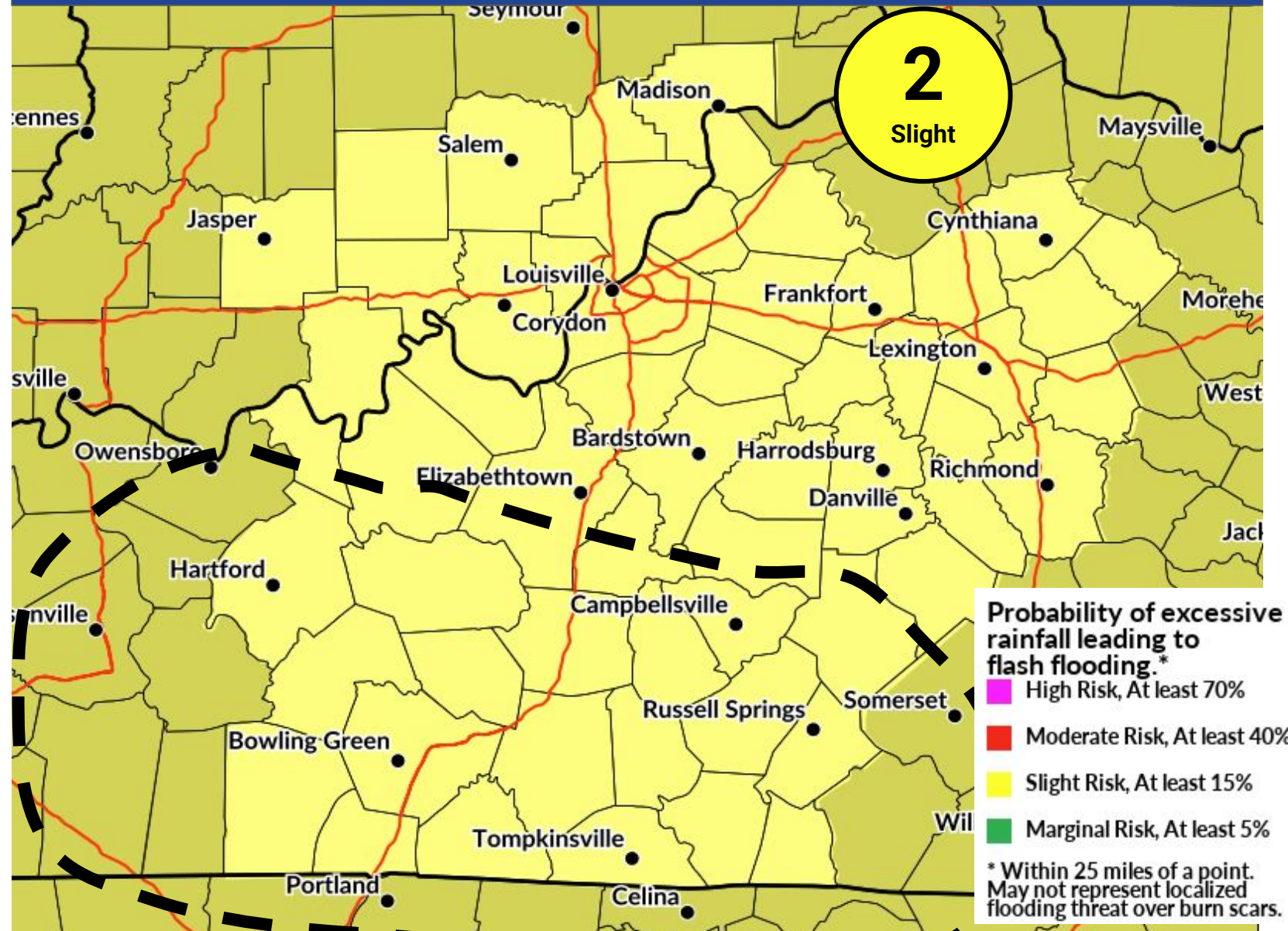
### Key Messages

- ➔ Additional showers/storms develop late this afternoon and tonight
- ➔ Rainfall amounts:
  - ◆ Widespread 0.5"- 2"
  - ◆ Localized higher amounts > 4"
- ➔ **Significant** localized flooding is possible with slow moving storms
- ➔ **What Is Uncertain:**
  - ◆ The precise location of heaviest rainfall totals. These could fall south/west of the local area. Greatest concern is in southern Kentucky, in the dashed black contoured area.

## Storms Weaken as They Move East

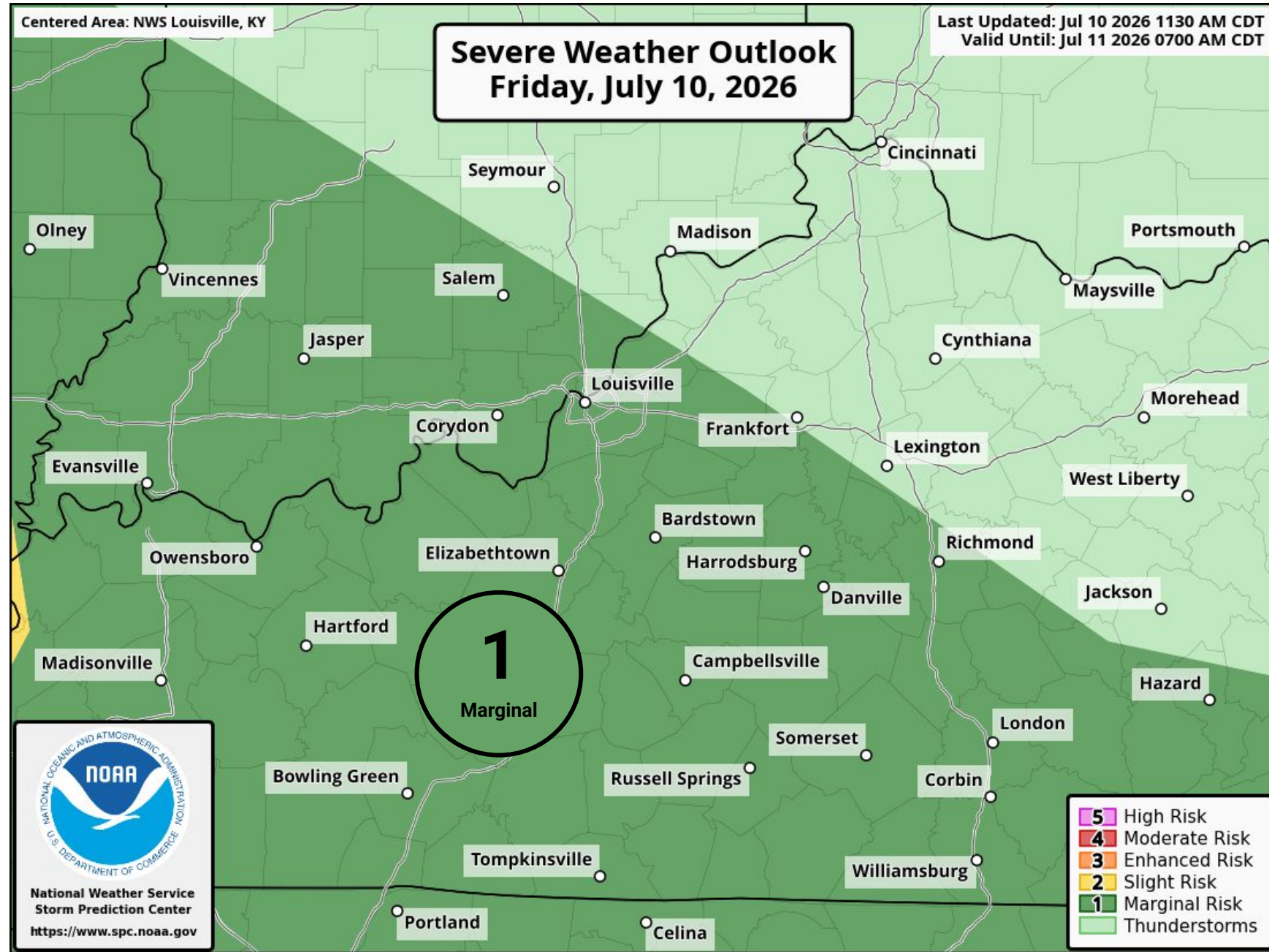
### → Hazards

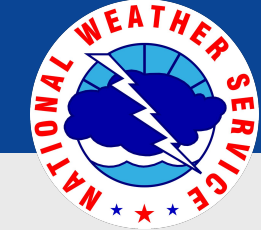
- ◆ Gusty to locally damaging winds
- ◆ Frequent lightning
- ◆ Torrential rainfall

### → Timing

- ◆ Scattered to isolated afternoon evening
- ◆ Potential cluster of storms late Friday night/early Sat. morning

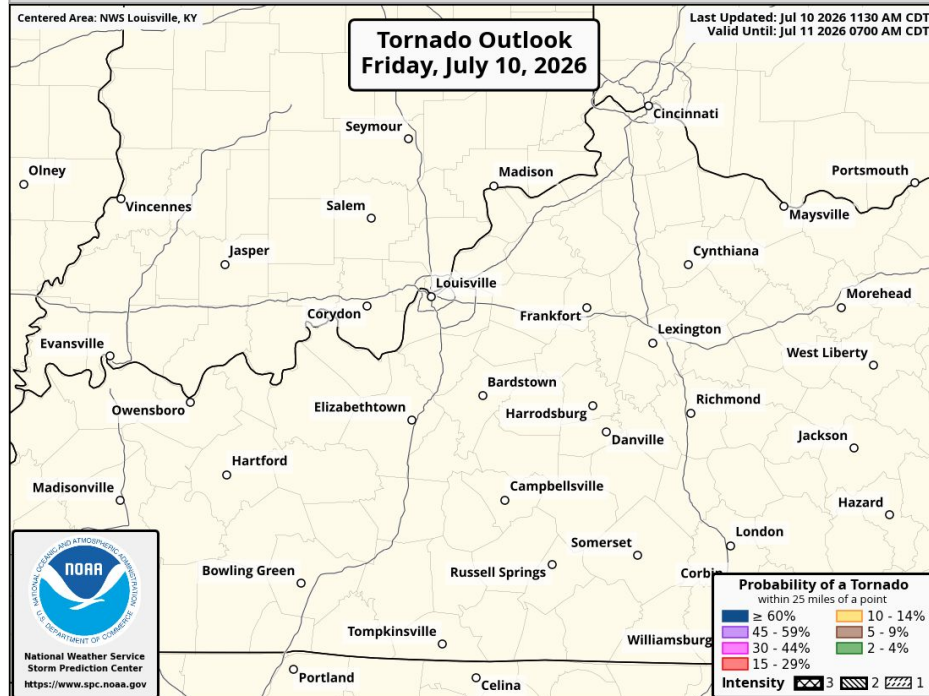

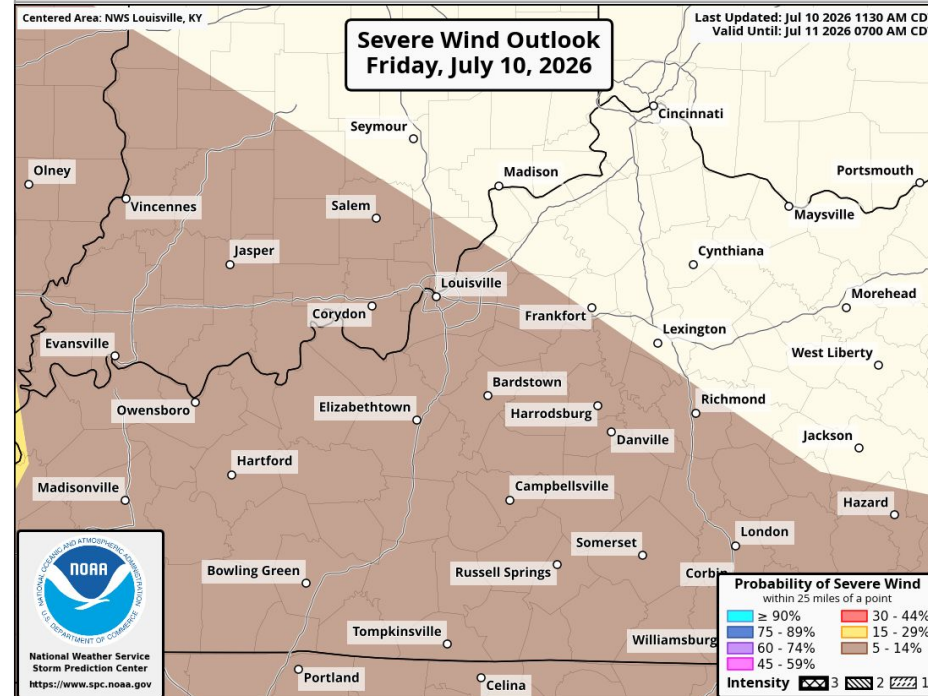
## Gusty Winds the Primary Severe Weather Threat

**Hazard: Very Low Tornado Risk**

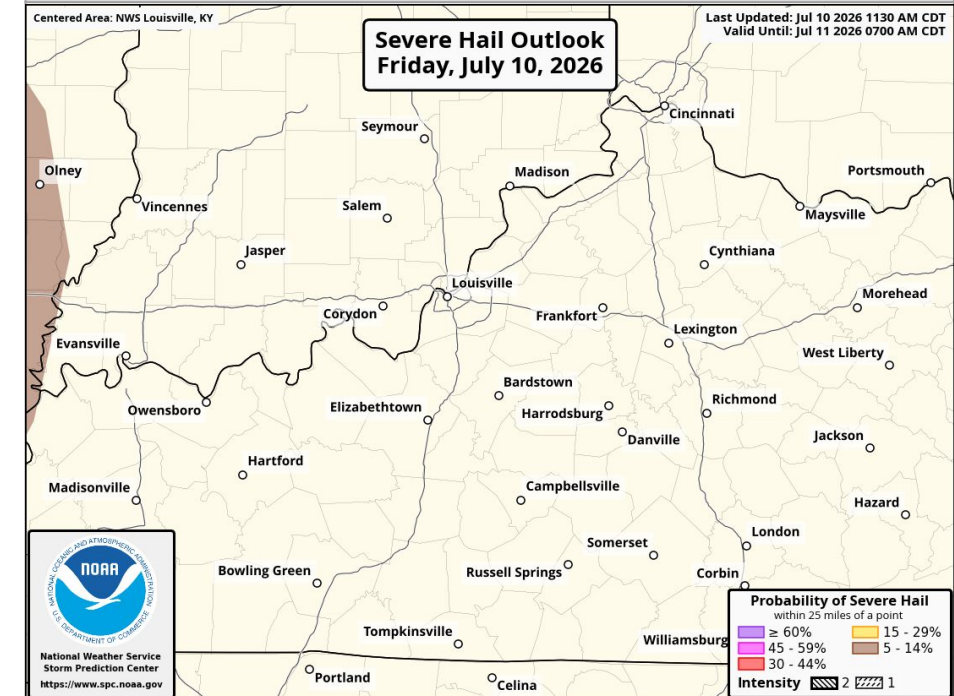
### Wind Probability



**Hazard: Up to 60 MPH Winds**

**Potential Impacts:** Tree damage, power line damage, minor shingle damage, outdoor furniture and loose objects blown around, crop damage.

### Hail Probability



**Hazard: Very Low Hail Risk**





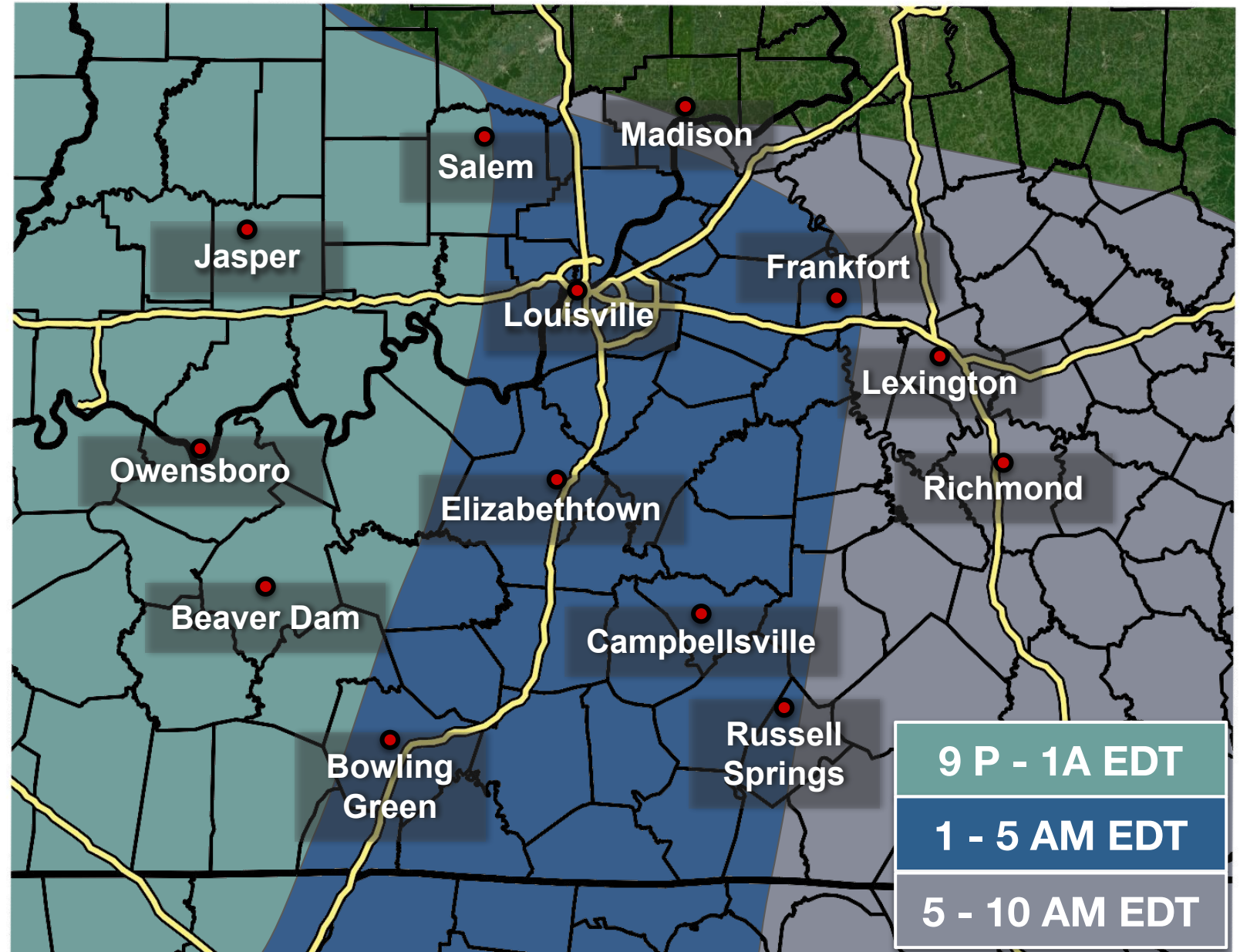
# Timing of Friday Night Storm Cluster

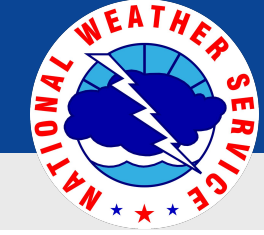

Potentially we could see these in two waves...

- A cluster of thunderstorms is expected to form over the Plains Friday afternoon then work towards southern IN/western KY
- This could be one wave or potentially two waves of heavy rain and storms
- Recent trend is slowing this wave down so it could come in more towards Saturday morning
- Flash flooding remains the main threat as repeated heavy rain over already saturated ground could lead to significant flash flooding

Gusty Straight-Line Winds are the main Severe Threat

## → Hazards

- ◆ Gusty to locally damaging winds
- ◆ Isolated brief tornado
- ◆ Frequent lightning
- ◆ Torrential rainfall

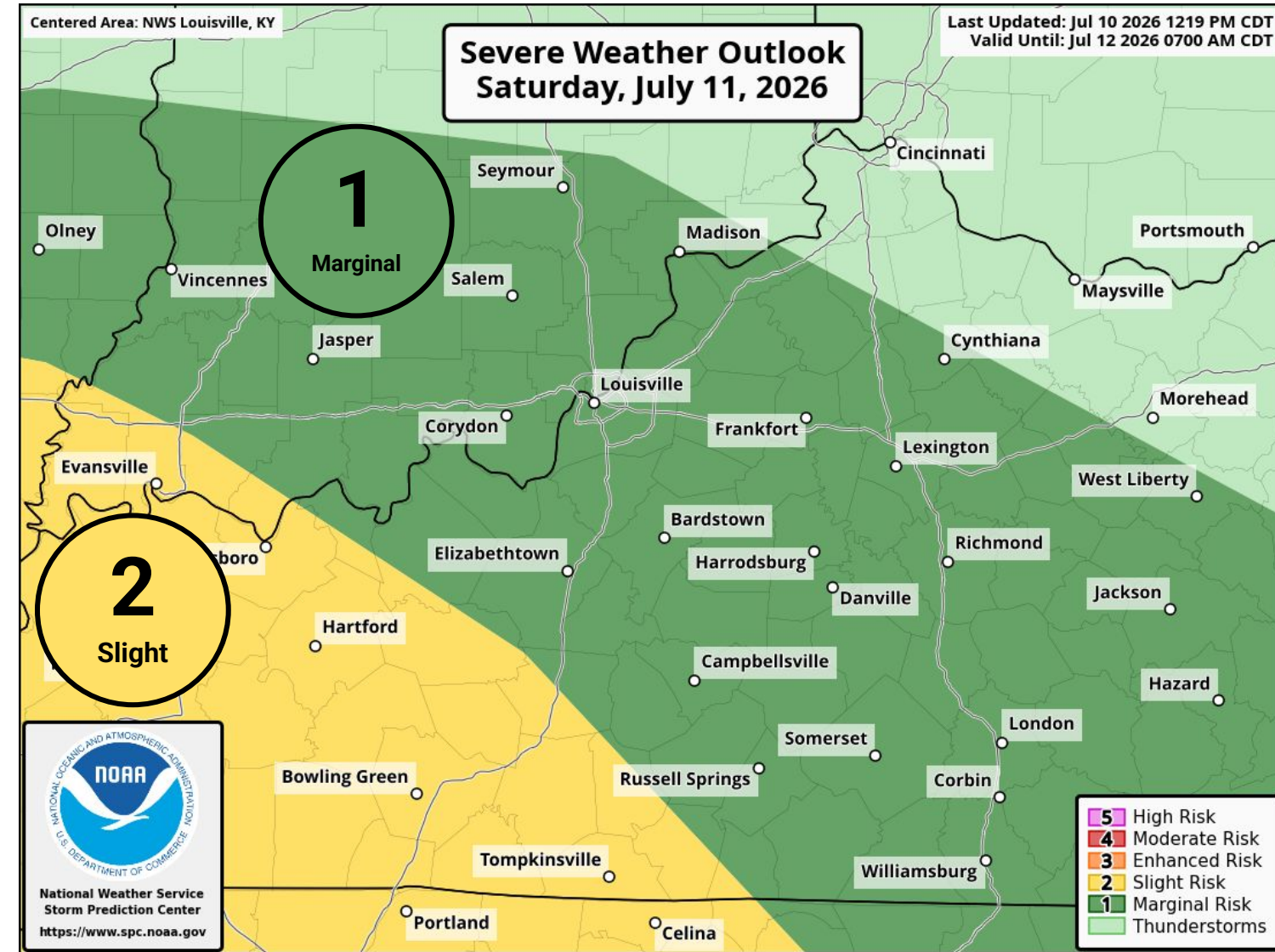
## → Timing

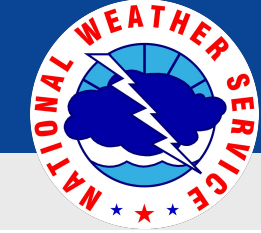
- ◆ Waves of scattered storms through the day and night
- ◆ Best timing for severe storms in the evening into early overnight

## Saturday - Saturday Night Severe Outlook



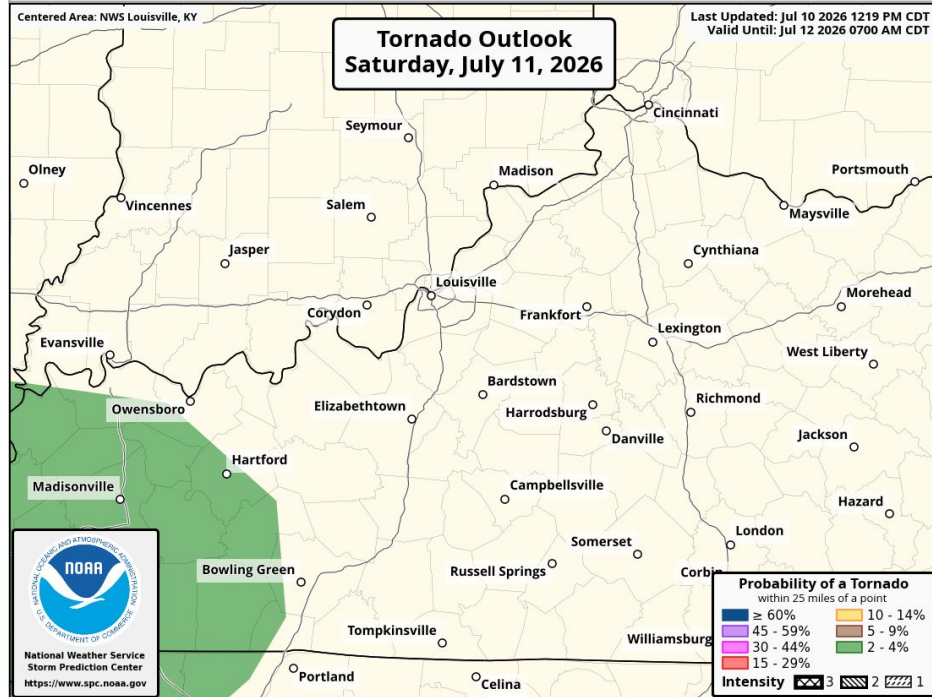

## Gusty Winds the Primary Severe Weather Threat

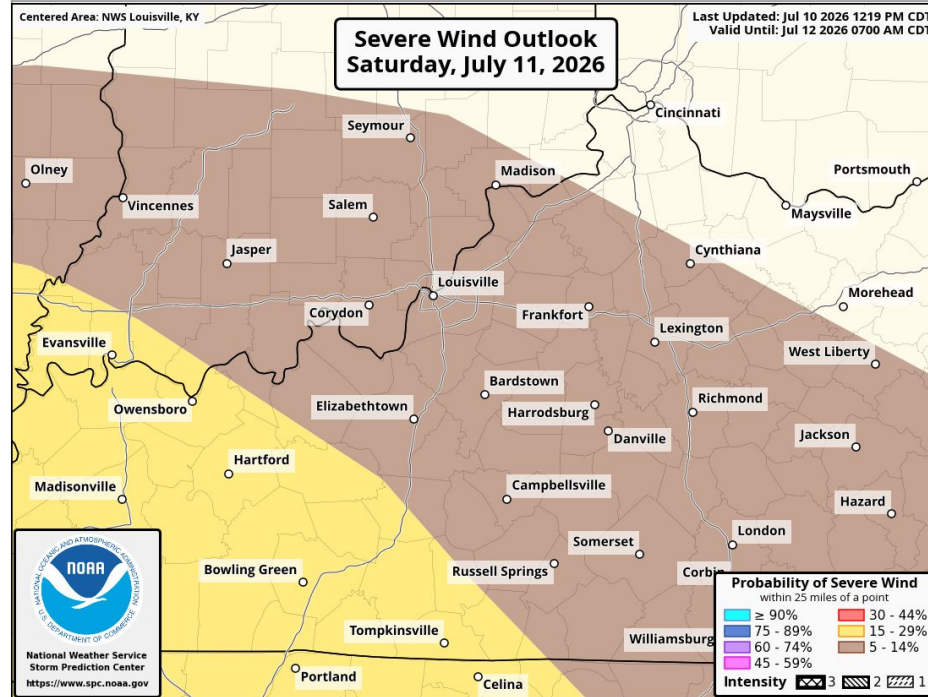
### Tornado Probability



**Hazard: Low Tornado Risk**

**Potential Impacts:** Property and tree damage.

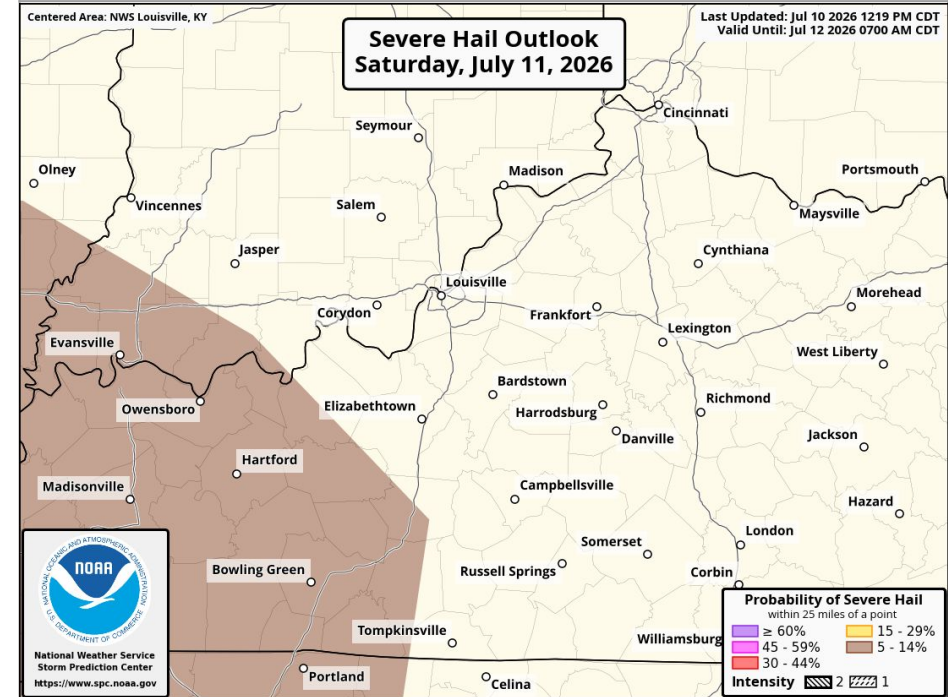
### Wind Probability



**Hazard: Up to 60 MPH Winds**

**Potential Impacts:** Tree damage, power line damage, minor shingle damage, outdoor furniture and loose objects blown around, crop damage.

### Hail Probability



**Hazard: Low Hail Risk**

**Potential Impacts:** Damage to vehicles, homes, property, agricultural damage, injury to those caught outside.





# Flash Flooding Risk Continues

Multiple Rounds of Showers and Storms Saturday AM & Saturday PM-Sunday

## Key Messages

- Multiple rounds of additional showers and storms will likely (60-80%) move across the area on Saturday and Saturday Night
- **Significant** flash flooding is possible in repeated areas of storms through central Kentucky
- **Points of Uncertainty:**
  - ◆ Precise location of heaviest rainfall totals
  - ◆ Strength of each passing wave and the amount of rain from each one
