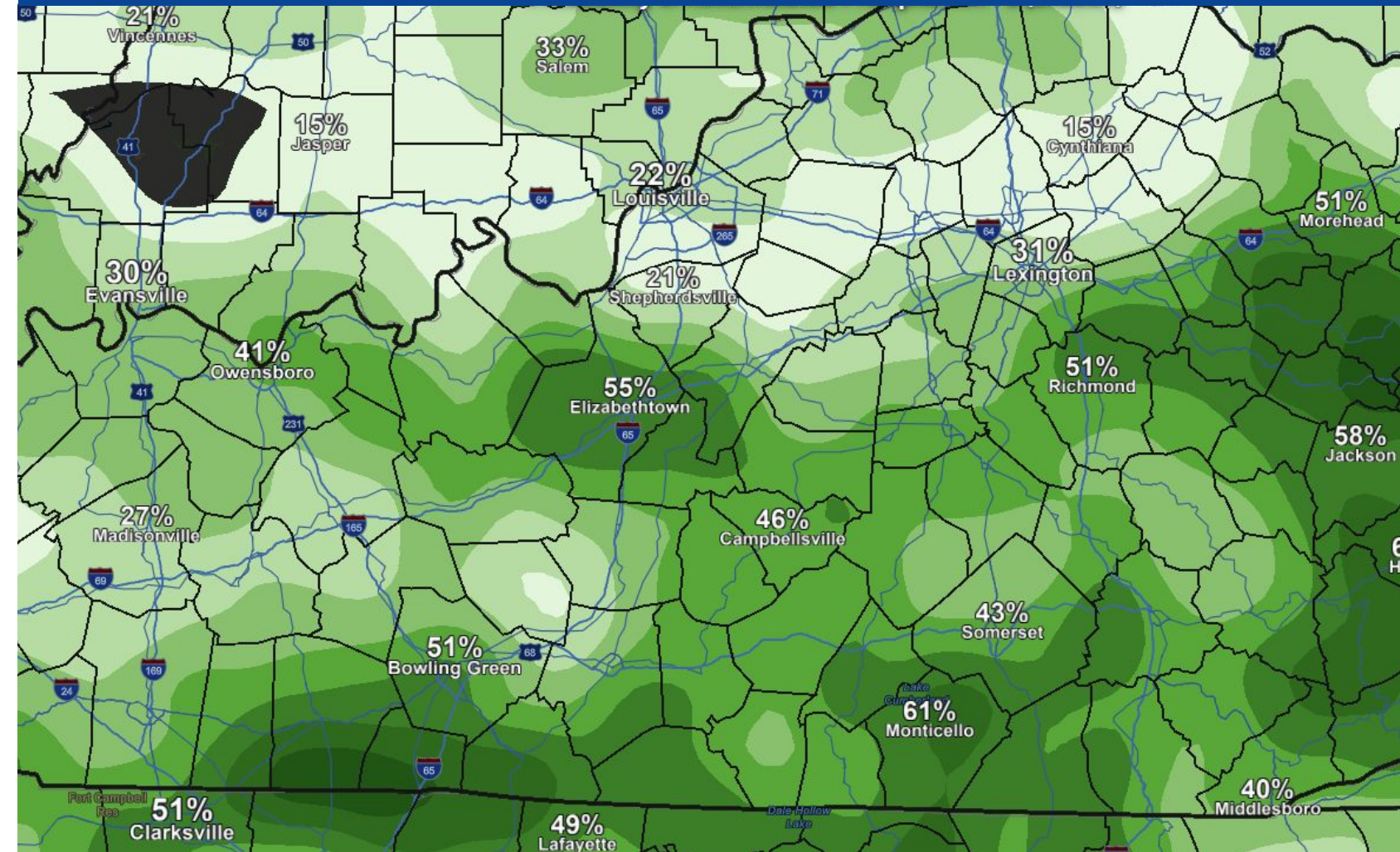
Summary:

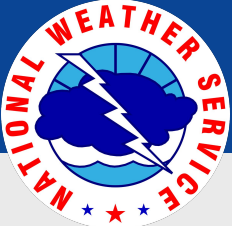
- ◆ **Flood Watch continues through 2 AM EDT/1 AM CDT Sunday across all of southern IN and central KY**
- ◆ **Flood Watch extended through 7 PM EDT/6 PM CDT Sunday along and south of the Western KY/Bluegrass Parkways**
- ◆ Clusters of showers and thunderstorms will redevelop later this afternoon into the evening tonight.
- ◆ More scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected Sunday afternoon and evening.

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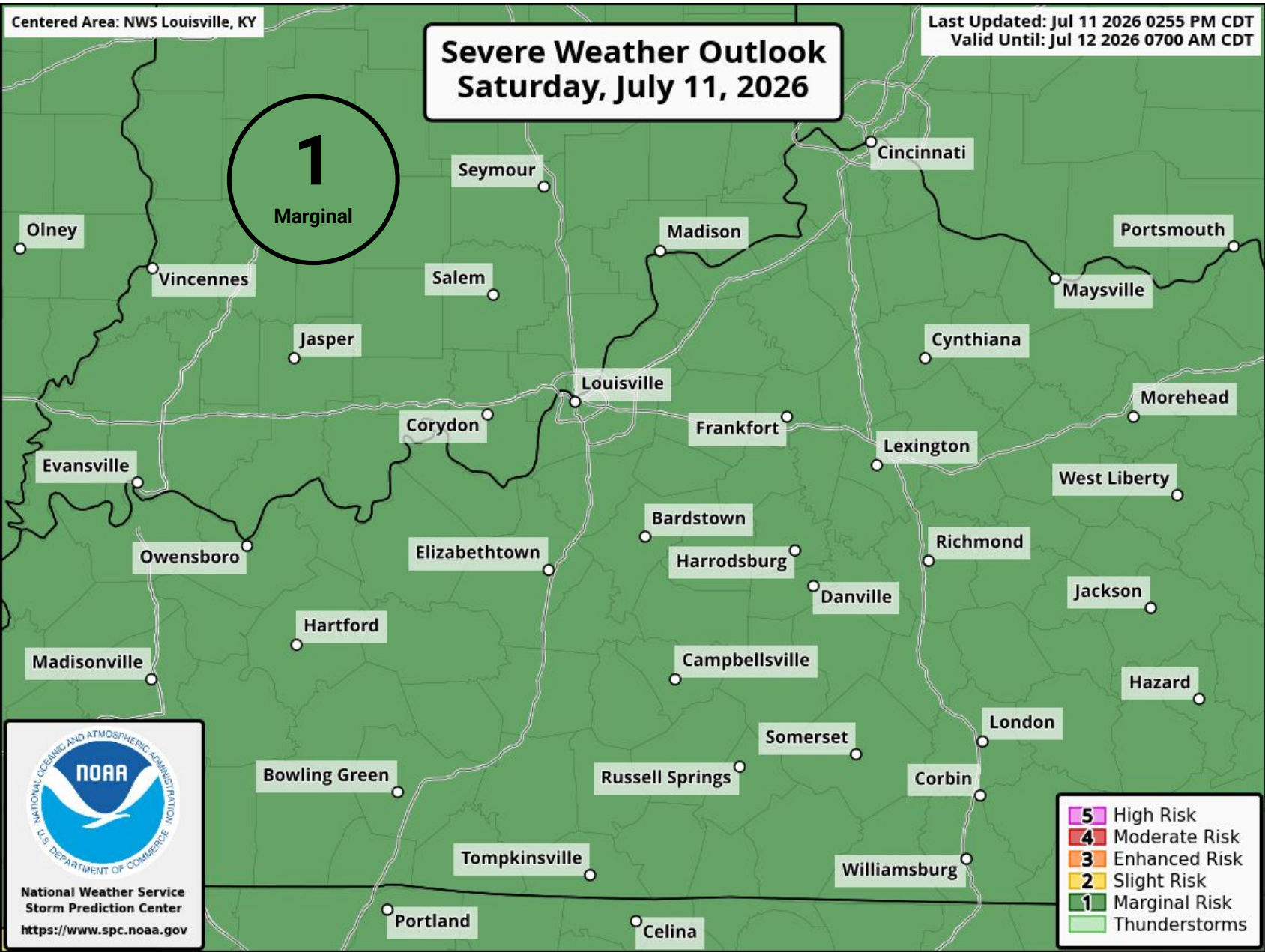
Saturday Evening Into Early Sunday

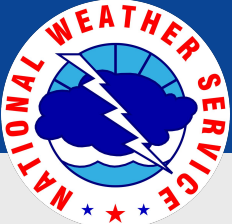
→ Hazards

- ◆ Locally damaging winds
- ◆ Frequent lightning and torrential rainfall
- ◆ A brief tornado

→ Key Messages

- ◆ Thunderstorms are developing now and will continue into this evening.
- ◆ The severe potential has trended slightly less for south central Kentucky



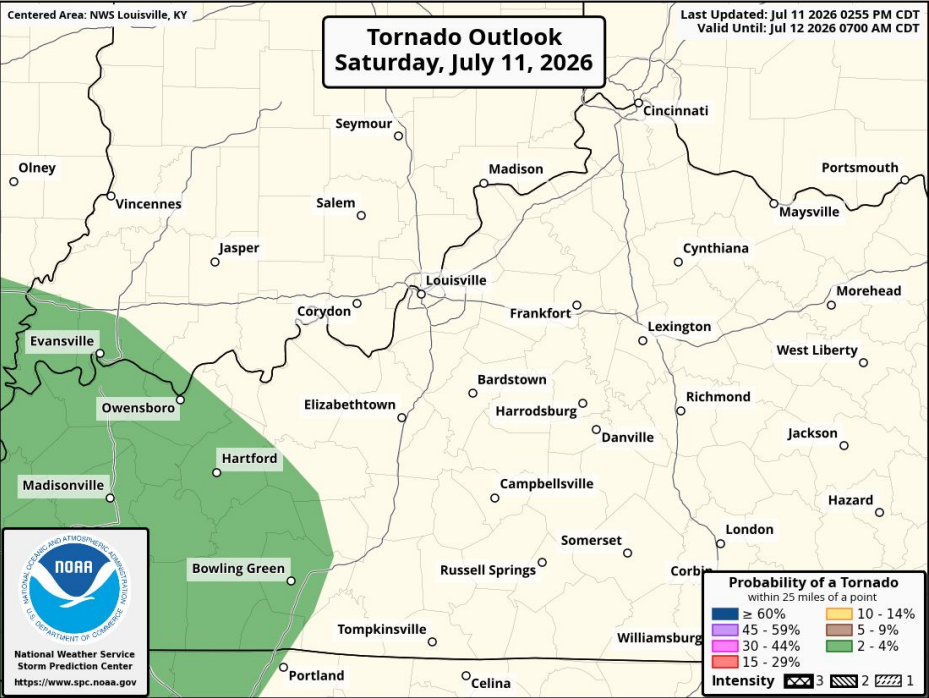


Saturday/Early Sunday Severe Hazards

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Gusty Winds Remains the Primary Severe Weather Threat

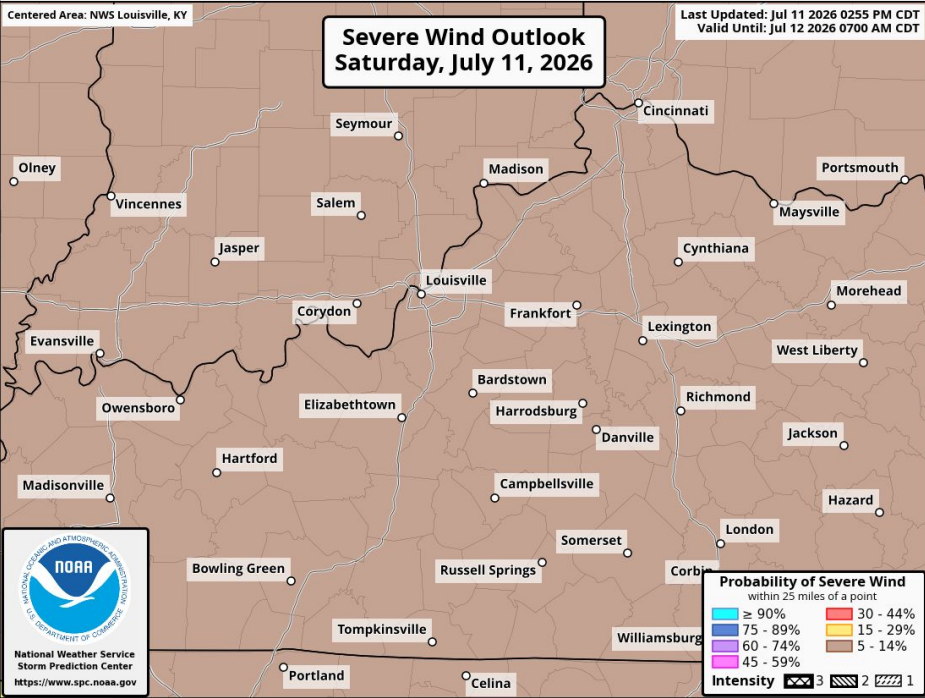
Tornado Probability



Hazard: Low Tornado Risk

Potential Impacts: Property and tree damage.

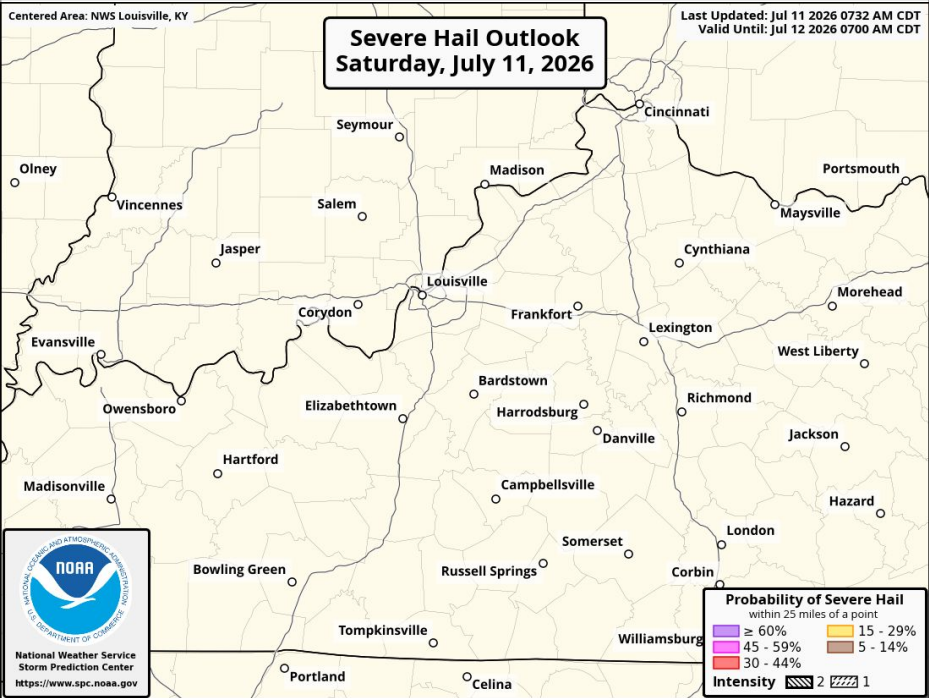
Wind Probability



Hazard: Up to 60 MPH Winds

Potential Impacts: Tree damage, power line damage, minor shingle damage, outdoor furniture and loose objects blown around, crop damage.

Hail Probability



Hazard: Low Hail Risk

Potential Impacts: Little to no impact expected.





Storm Timing Saturday Afternoon/Evening

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Thunderstorms re-develop Saturday afternoon across southern Indiana

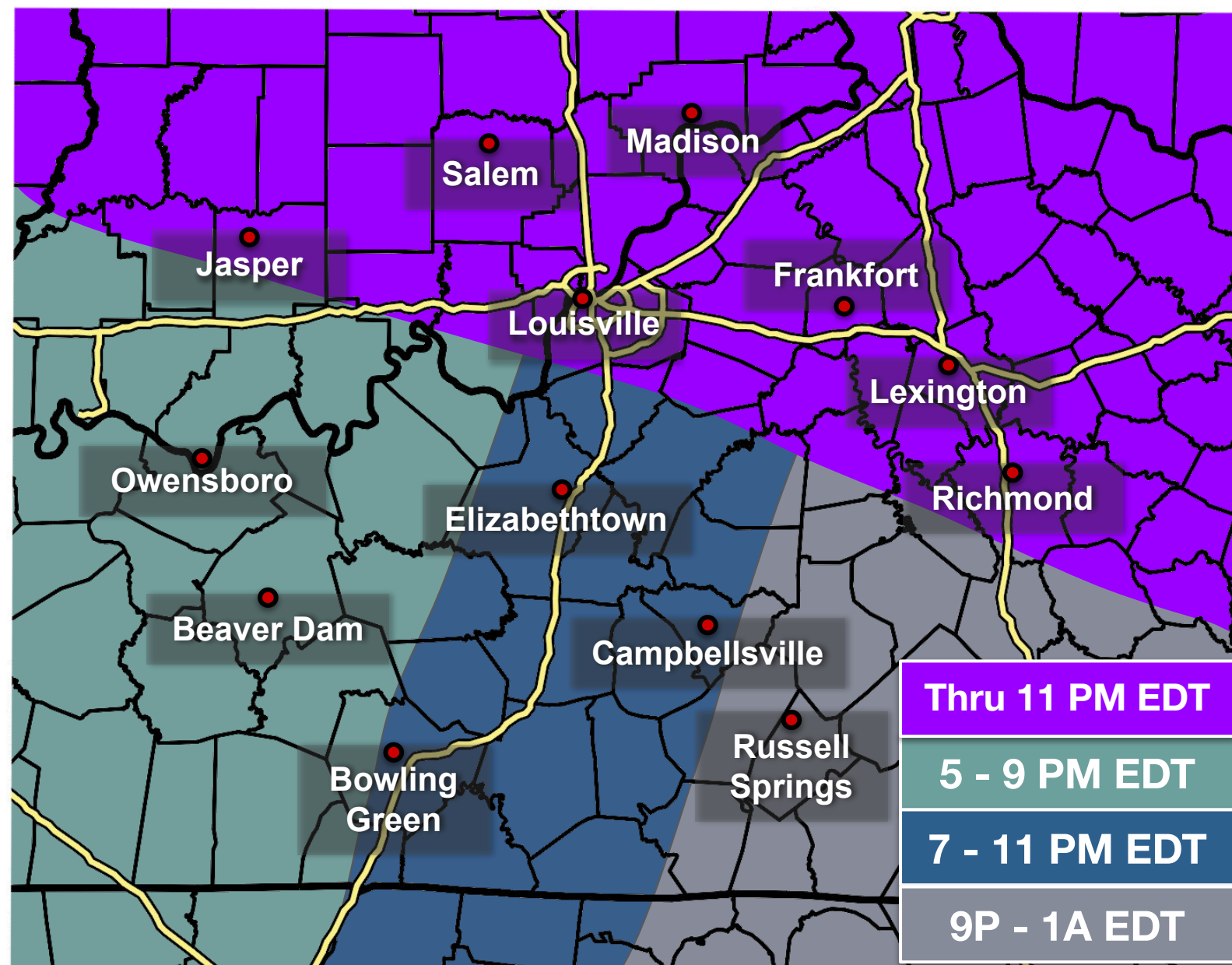
- Boundary across southern IN/northern KY will help to develop scattered storms this afternoon in the purple area that will move slowly south.
- A separate area of storms is also expected to move from northwest to southeast, mainly across KY, this evening.
- Gusty, locally damaging straight line winds are the main threat.
- *Note: There is a chance storms develop ahead of this boundary and across the KY/TN border.*

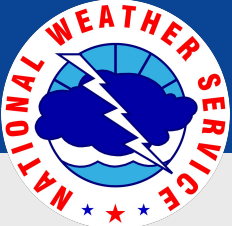

Flash Flooding Risk Sunday PM

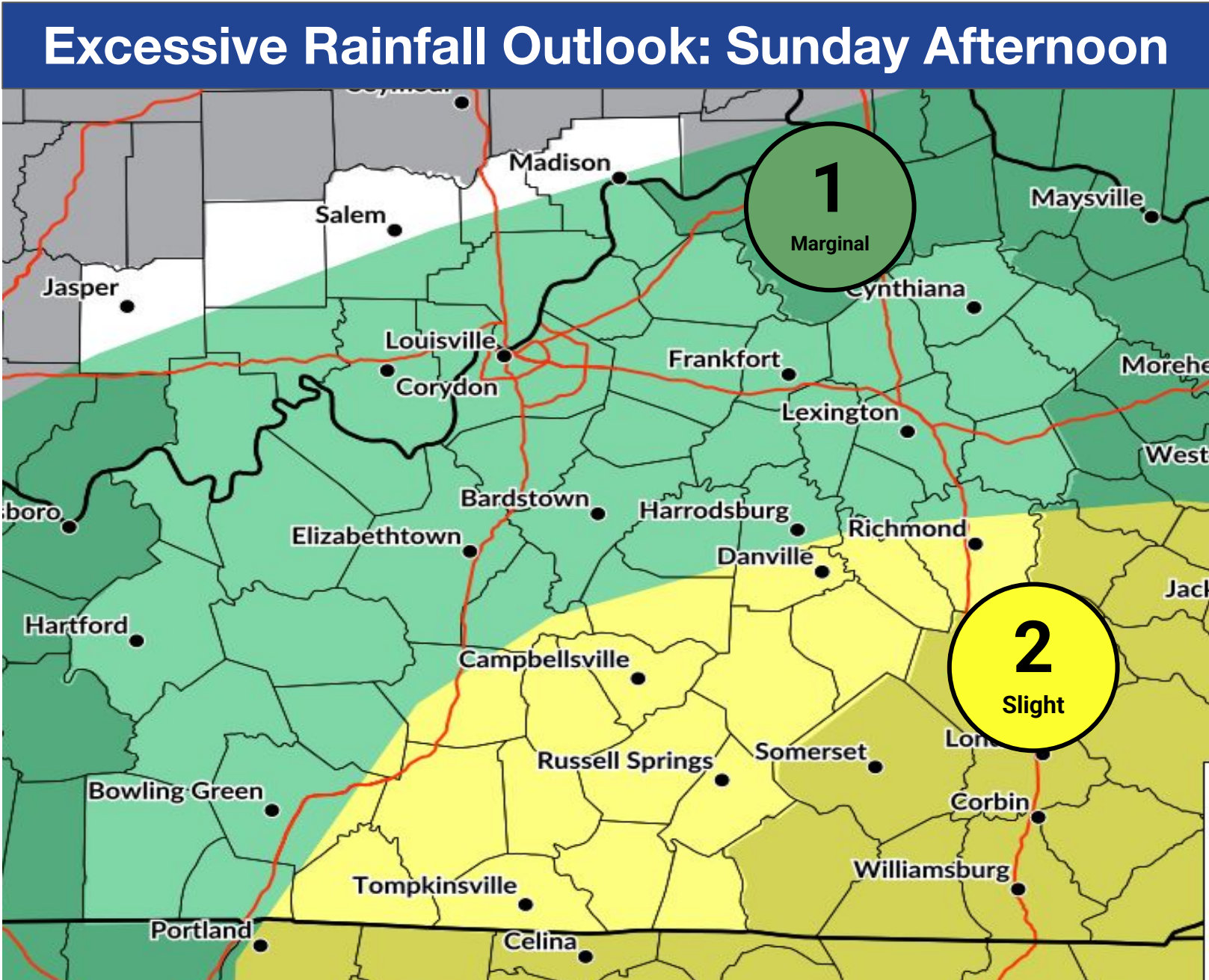
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Flash Flooding Risk Returns Sunday Afternoon

Key Messages

- Scattered storms linger for another afternoon on Sunday
- Morning is mostly dry, but storms return 1-10 PM during peak heating
- **Isolated** flash flooding is still a threat in repeated areas of storms through south central Kentucky, though many areas will receive little to no rain
- Sunday PM Totals: Scattered totals of 1-2"
 - ◆ Isolated Storm Totals: 2+"
- **Point of Uncertainty:**
 - ◆ Precise location of heaviest rainfall totals
