Flood Watch in effect through Saturday night

Key Messages

- Multiple rounds of thunderstorms and heavy rain will result in **areas of flash flooding**.
- **Flood Watch** for all of southern IN and Kentucky.
- **Locally Significant Flash Flooding** could occur from repeated rounds of storms over the same locations.
- Total rainfall amounts of 1-2 inches, with locally **significant amounts of 2-5+”** possible.
- Have multiple ways to receive flood alerts.

Multiple Rounds of Thunderstorms and Heavy Rainfall Today

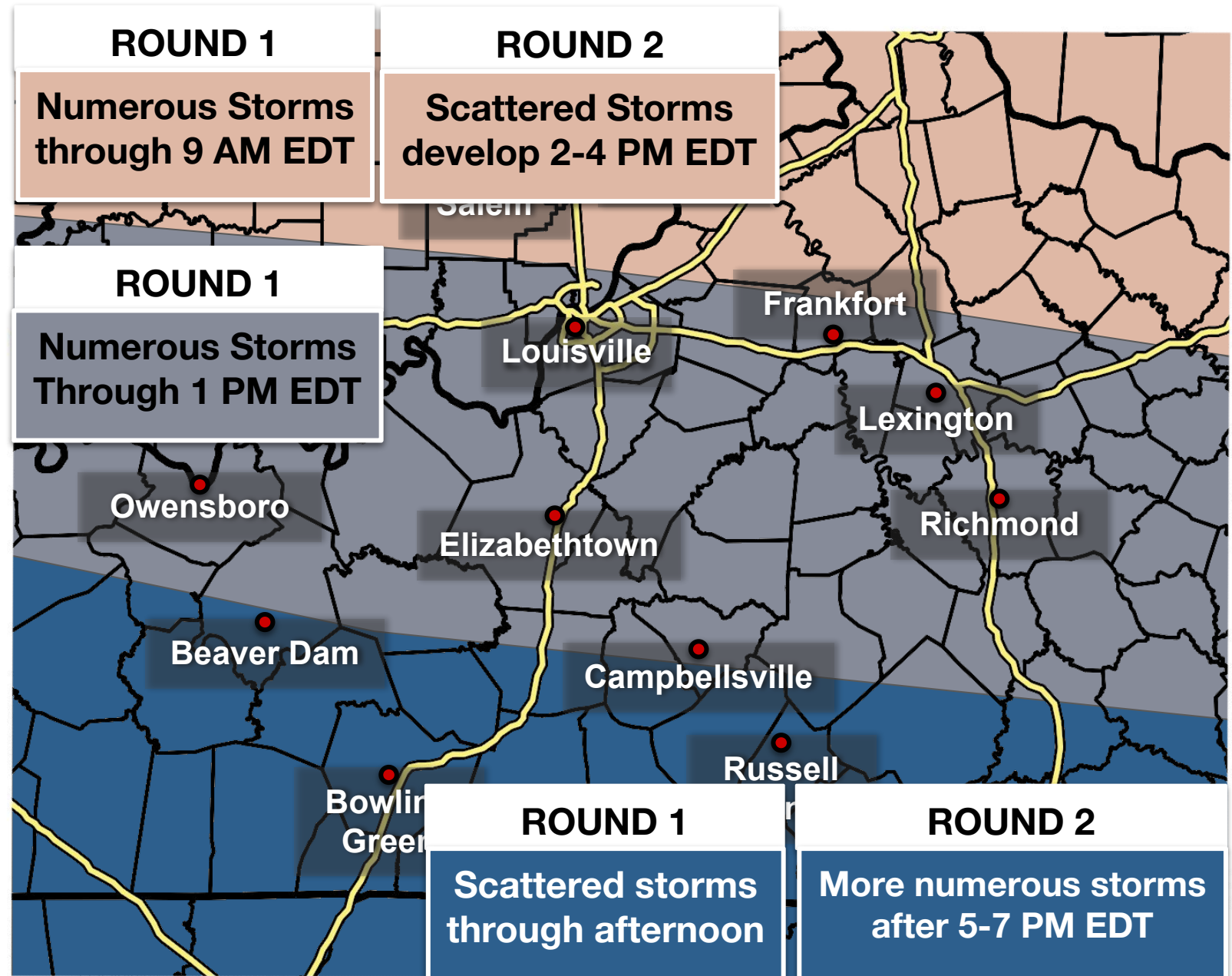
Key Messages

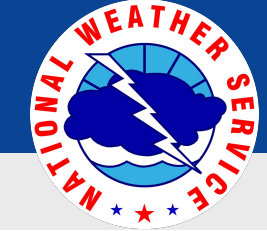
- **Area 1:** Scattered storms this morning, then a break until early-mid afternoon, then additional scattered thunderstorms into the evening.
- **Area 2:** Morning storms linger into mid afternoon, then only isolated (20% coverage) storms during the late afternoon-evening.
- **Area 3:** 30% chance of a storm through the afternoon, then more numerous evening storms.
- **Main Risks:** Flooding, lower risk for locally damaging winds this afternoon-evening.

Confidence in Timing





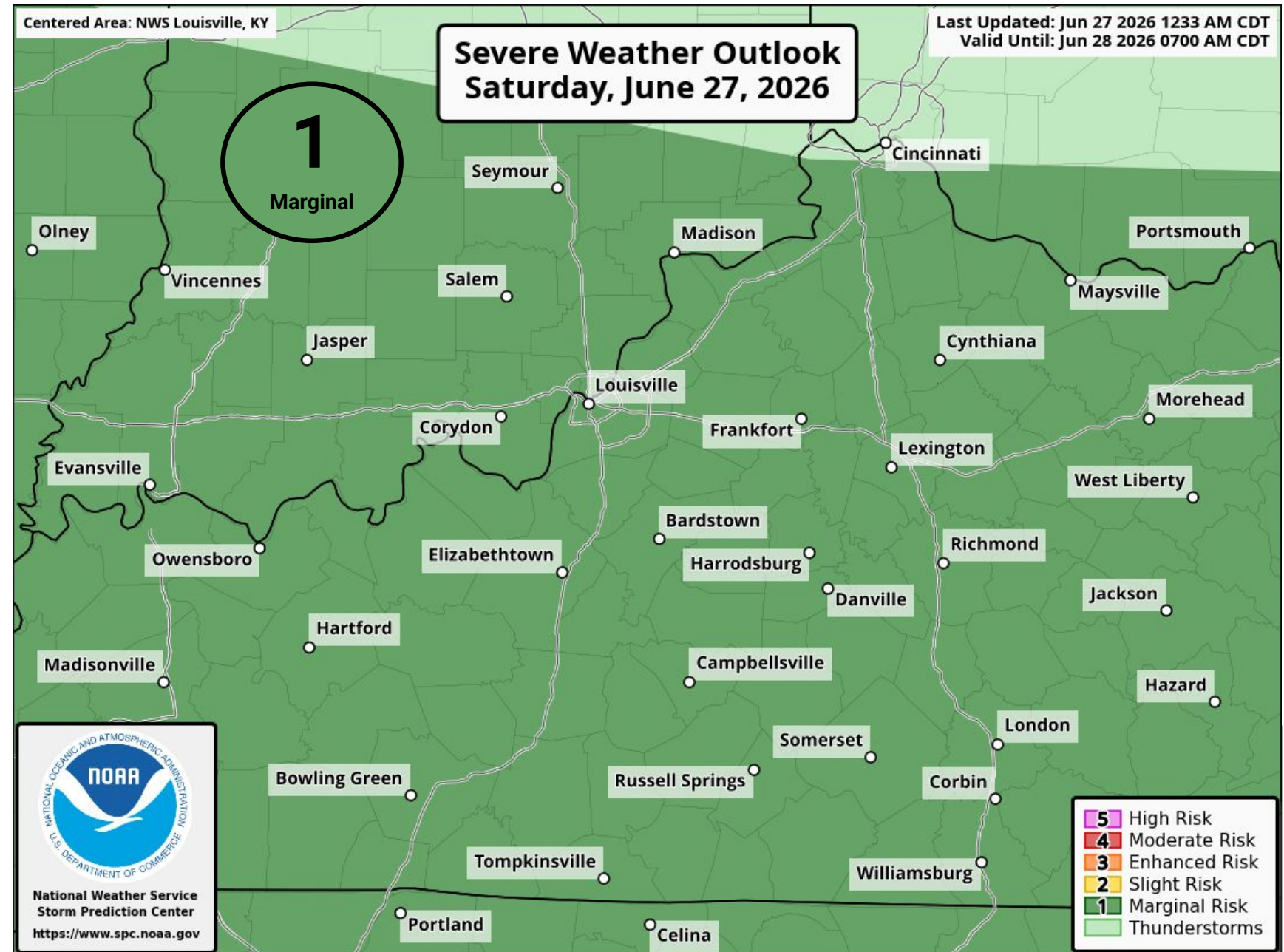
Severe Storm Risk Saturday Afternoon

Rounds of Storms May Bring Gusty Winds This Afternoon and Evening

Key Messages

- Repeated rounds of storms redevelop and move in from the west.
- **Marginal Risk** (Level 1 of 5) for severe weather.
- **Timing:** 2 - 11 PM EDT.
- **Main Threats:**
 - Primary risk is flash flooding
 - Lower risk (5-10%) for isolated strong winds

Confidence in Severe Storms



Dangerous Heat and Humidity Next Week

Triple digit heat indices each afternoon



Timing:

- Beginning Monday, continuing through at least Friday

What to Expect:

- Daily high temperatures well into the 90s with oppressive humidity
- High confidence (70-90% chance) in afternoon heat index values over 100°

Actions to Take



Hydrate

drink before you are thirsty



Wear Light Clothing

lightweight and light colored



Stay in Air Conditioning

especially during the day



Avoid Outdoor Activities

during the warmest parts of the day

Your Safe Place from **Flooding**

During a flood, water levels and flow speed can quickly change. You are safest by staying indoors, or seeking higher ground if shelter isn't available. If you're stuck outside when a flash flood occurs, do not attempt to cross flood waters by vehicle or on foot.

Extreme Heat Planning Timeline

Pre-Season

Start planning before hot weather arrives.

- ✓ Build an emergency kit
- ✓ Make a plan for power outages
- ✓ Become trained in first aid for heat-related emergencies
- ✓ Check that your A/C and fans are in working order

A Few Days Out

If the forecast calls for extreme heat, be ready.

- ✓ Gather food, water, and medication
- ✓ Make a list of friends and family to check on & help them prepare
- ✓ Know your local cooling shelters or other cool locations
- ✓ Reschedule outdoor events

During and After

Remain vigilant and stay informed.

- ✓ Stay in air conditioning and out of the sun if possible
- ✓ Check on friends, family, neighbors, and pets
- ✓ Drink plenty of water
- ✓ Take breaks and use a buddy system if working outdoors
