



Severe Storms This Evening

April 27, 2026
11:15 AM

Late Monday evening into early Tuesday morning

Key Messages:

- **What:** Strong to severe storms
- **When:** Timing may change slightly
7pm - 5am EDT / 6pm - 4am CDT
- **Where:** Greatest threat for severe weather is along and west of I-65
- **Details:** East of I-65, lack of daytime heating will allow storms to weaken
- **Actions:**
 - This will be a **nighttime** event, plan accordingly

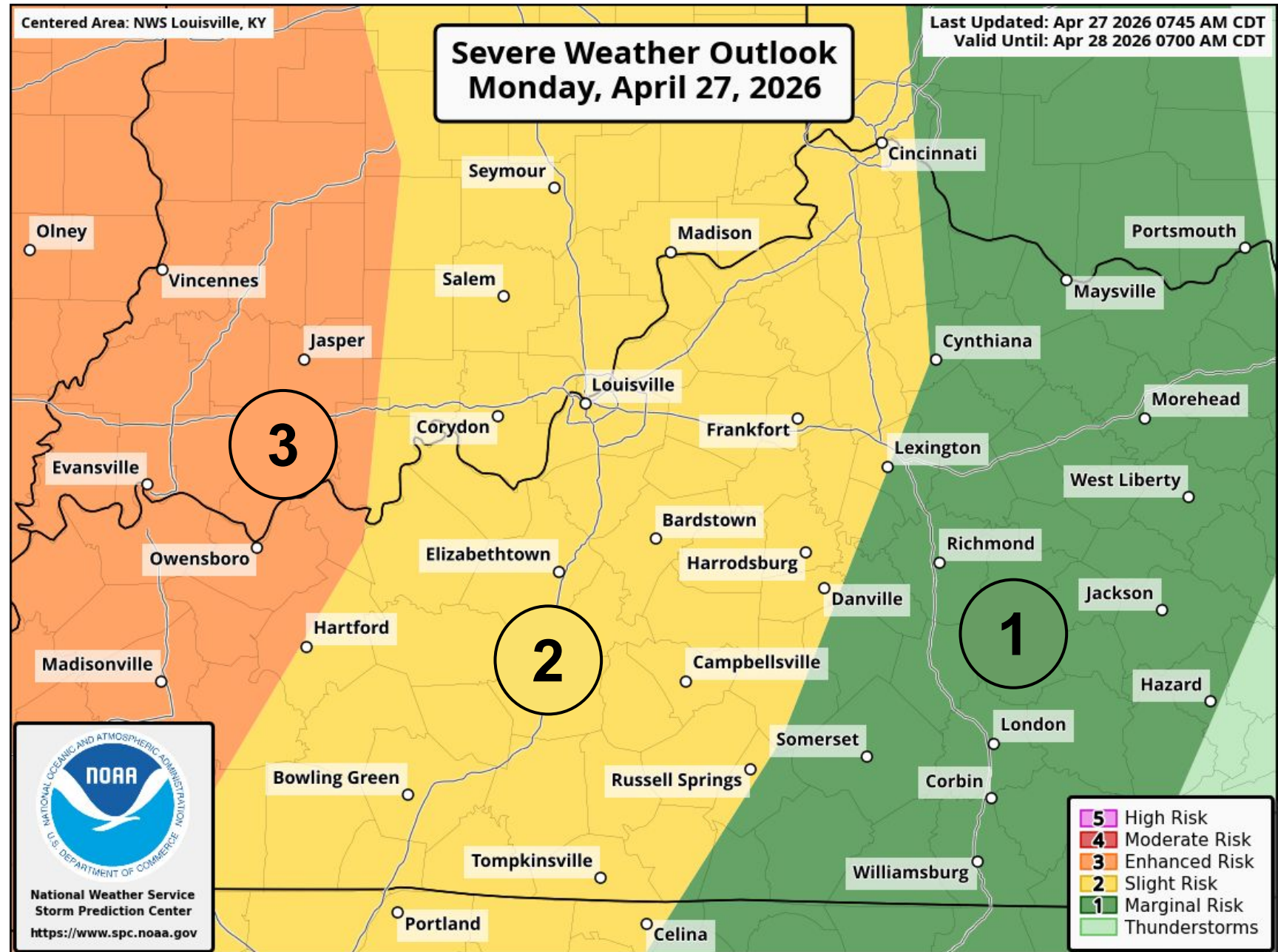

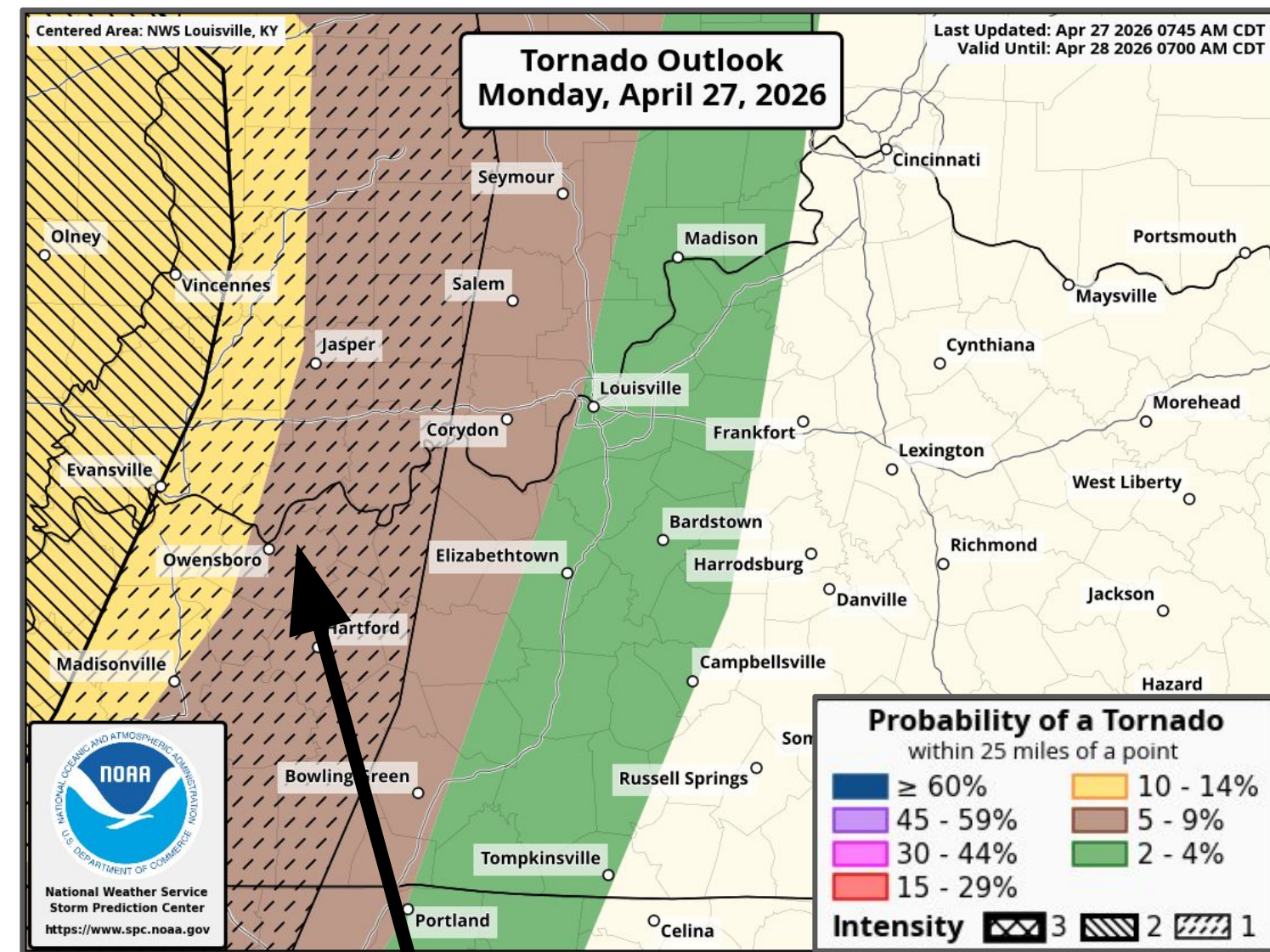
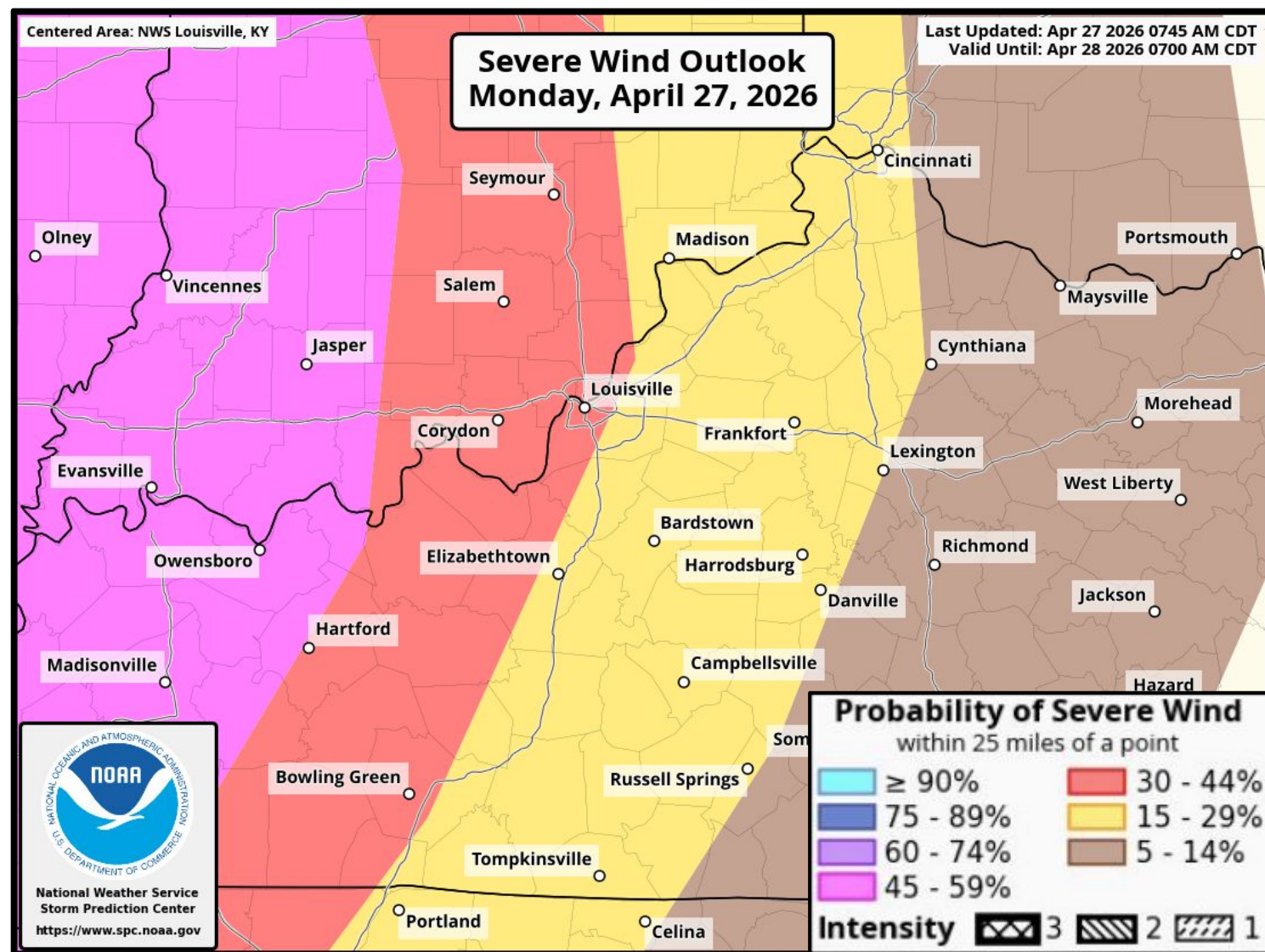
Wind and Tornado Probabilities

EF2+ tornadoes will be possible within the hatched area.



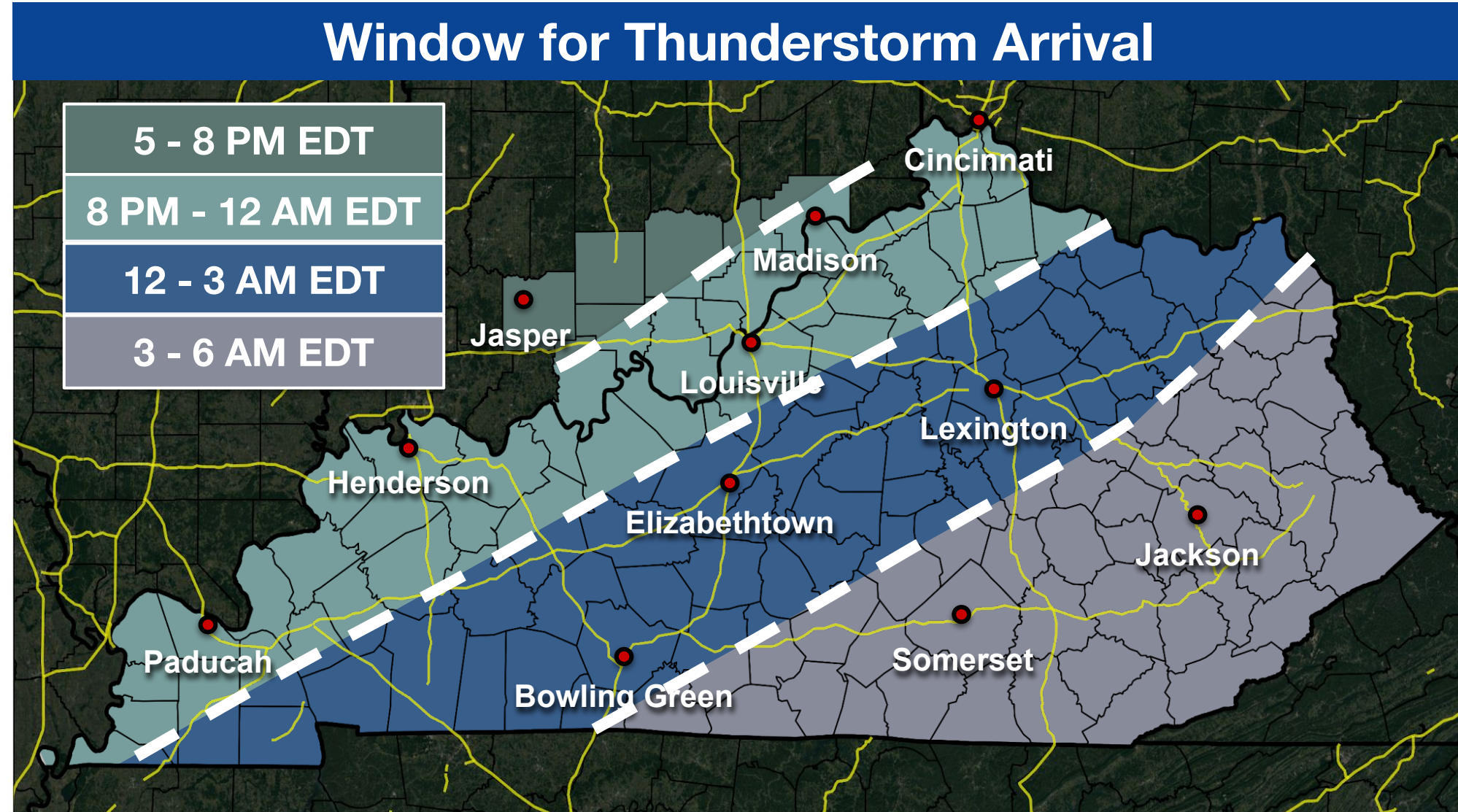
Thunderstorm Arrival Time

Monday, April 27 into Tuesday, April 28

Key Messages:

- Convection over Missouri this morning is leading to uncertainty with timing for this evening and tonight.
- Tornadoes and wind gusts to 70 mph will be the greatest threat, particularly west of I-65
 - ◆ Risk of severe weather will decrease eastward

Keep flashlight and sturdy shoes handy



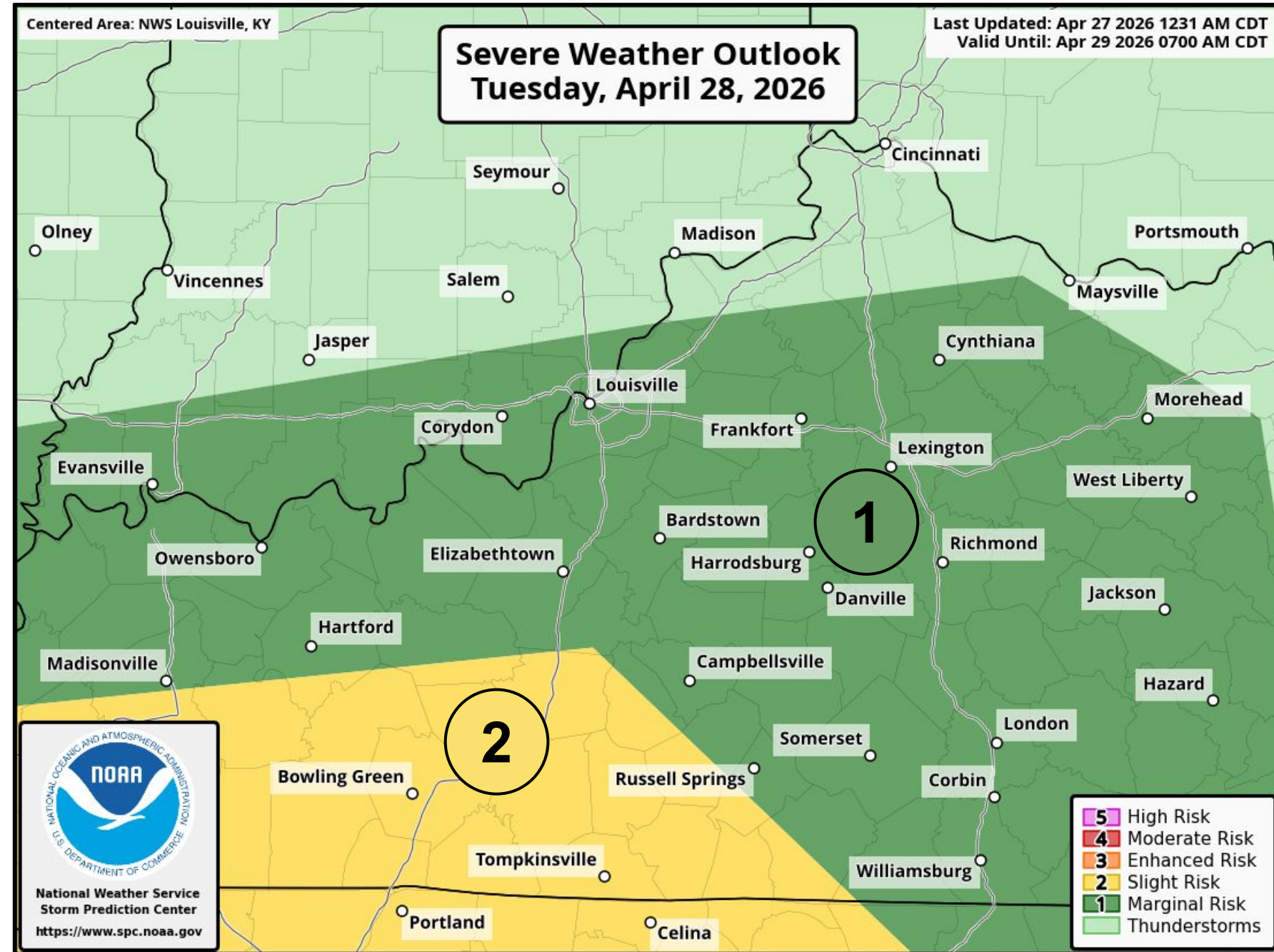
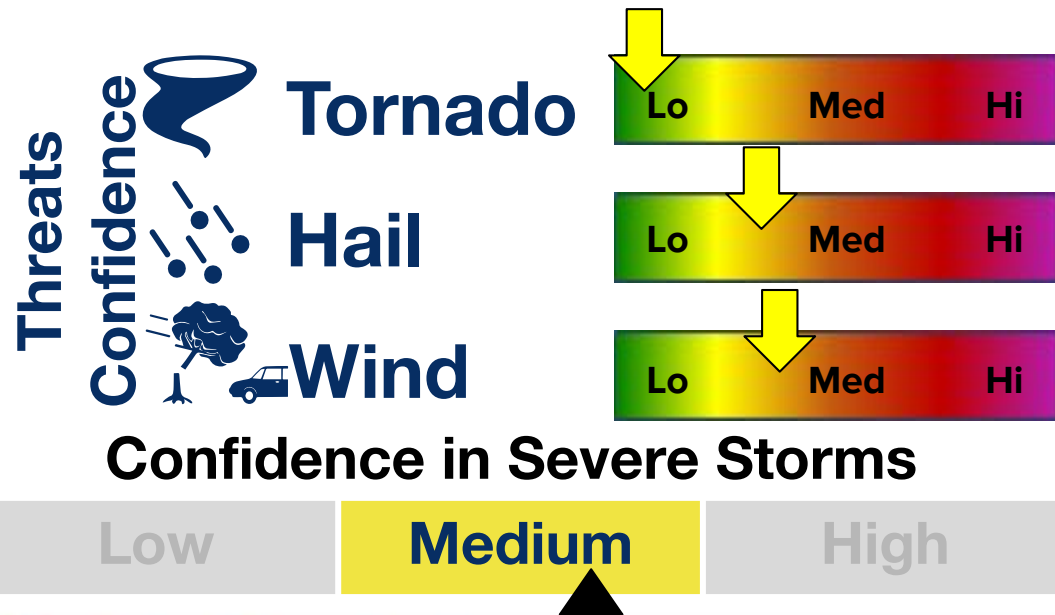
Severe Storms Tuesday Evening

Tuesday evening into early Wednesday morning

Key Messages:

- **What:** Strong to severe storms
- **When:** Tuesday evening into early Wednesday morning
7pm - 4am EDT / 6pm - 3am CDT
- **Where:** Greatest threat over Kentucky
- **Change from Yesterday:** Slight/Marginal pulled further to the southwest (some Indiana counties no longer in threat area)





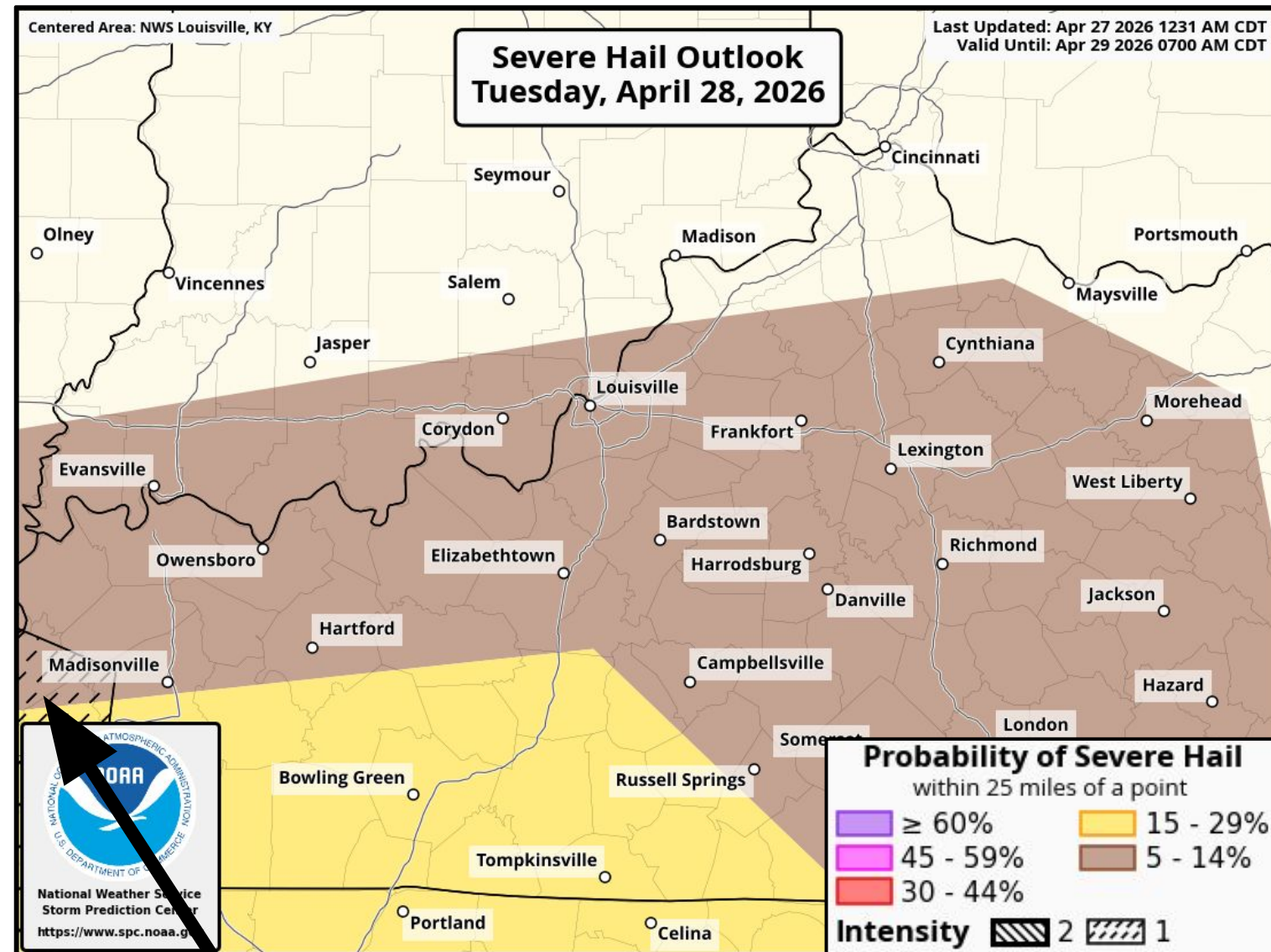
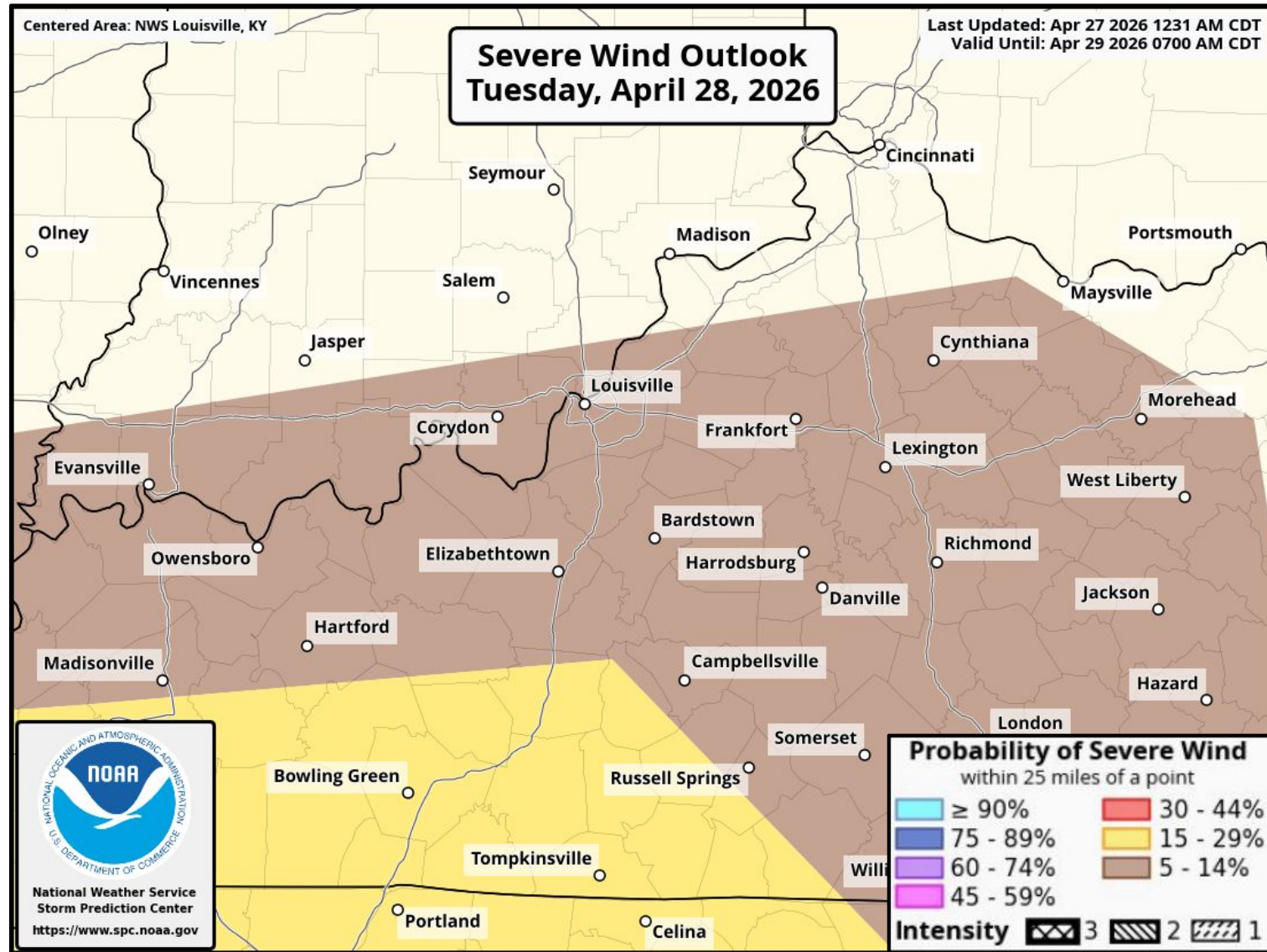
Wind and Hail Probabilities

Rainfall Forecast

Late Tonight through Wednesday

Key Messages:

- Heavy rainfall may bring brief ponding and minor flooding.
- A much needed widespread 1.5-3.0 inches is expected from tonight through Wednesday.
- Some areas west of I-65 will see close to 3.5 inches.

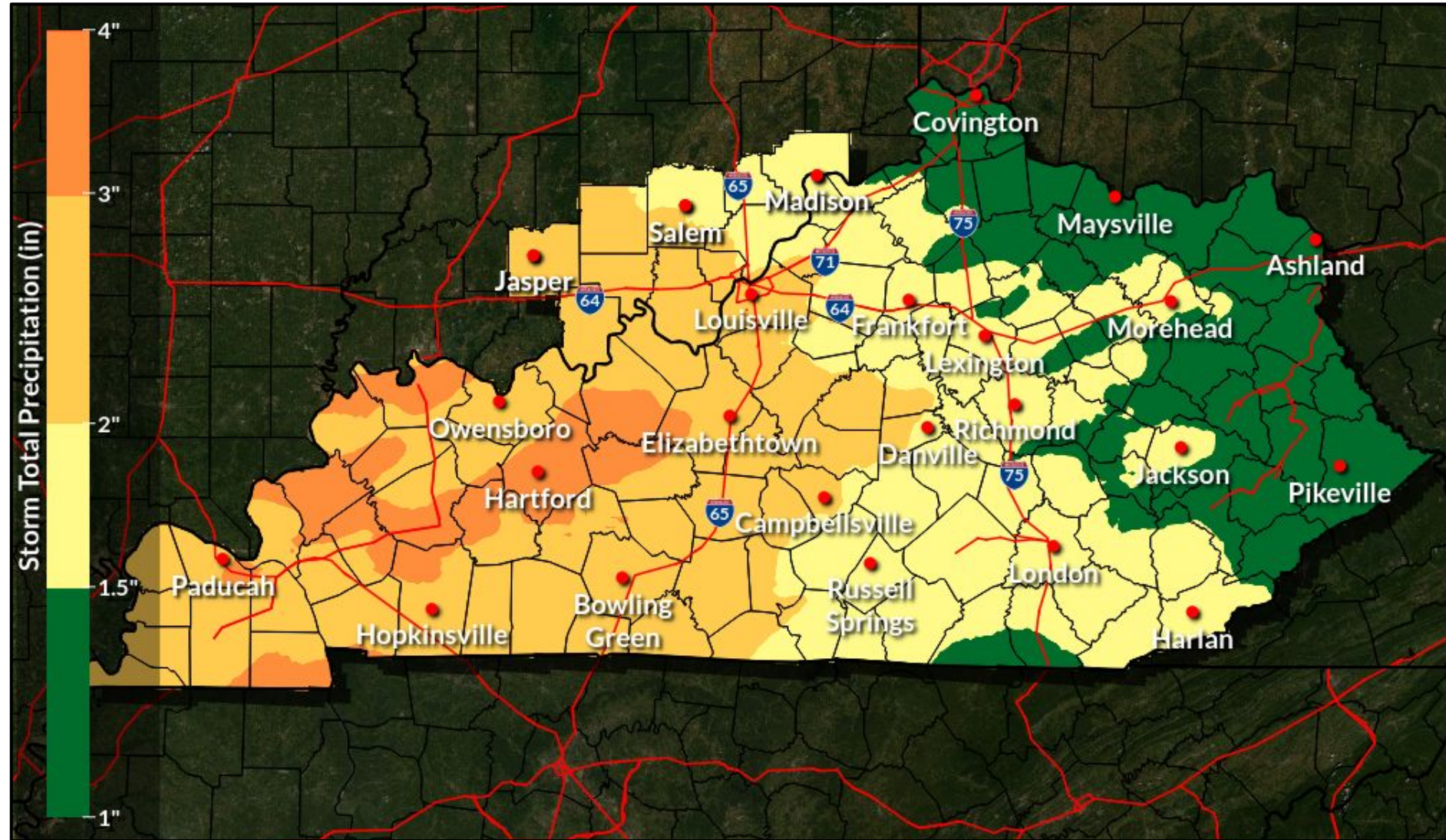

Below Normal Temperatures Ahead

April 27, 2026
11:15 AM

Thursday through the Weekend

Key Messages:

- A stronger cold front is expected to bring cooler and drier air later this week
- Cooler than normal temperatures are expected:
 - ◆ **Normal** High Temperatures: low-mid 70s
 - ◆ **Current** High Forecast: mid 60s
 - ◆ **Normal** Low Temperatures: around 50
 - ◆ **Current** Low Forecast: upper 30s and low 40s
 - ◆ Cold spots could see mid 30s, patchy frost possible this weekend (5/2-3)
