Station History Lexington, Kentucky

October 10, 1872: Station established by the United States Army at the State College on South Limestone Street.

July 31, 1876: Station ceased operation. The reason is not known.

October 24, 1887: Station re-opened, in the Carty Building on the southwest corner of Main Street and Mill Street.

September 9, 1888: Station moved to the University of Kentucky campus in the Tower State College Building on South Limestone Street.

July 17, 1915: Station moved to Rooms 1408-1410 of the Fayette National Bank Building on the northeast corner of Main Street and Upper Street. On this date Weather Bureau personnel began taking observations.

July 29, 1933: The first order station downtown was closed and a second order station was opened at 41 Mentelle Park.

September 2, 1934: Station moved to 703 Melrose Avenue.

October 10, 1940: Station moved to 218 Chenault Road.

July 20, 1944: A first-order station was established at Blue Grass Field on the ground floor of the south wing of the Administration Building.

March 17, 1976: The station changed rooms but stayed in Blue Grass Field's Administration Building. March 1, 1996: ASOS commissioned.

October 20-21, 2009: ASOS moved to accommodate a new runway.
