Widespread flash flooding impacted the southwest side of Chicago. The city received over 3,000 service requests for water in basements, a large majority of which were from areas near and east of Midway Airport. The 17-year-old boy was recovered and transported to a nearby hospital. He was later announced deceased. A high swim risk was in effect advertising life threatening swimming conditions with waves three to five feet high.
