A tornado with peak winds of 95 mph touched down in a field approximately two miles east of Clifton. In the first few minutes of its lifespan, the tornado largely remained over open fields and may have briefly lifted as little damage was observed west of Route 45. The tornado began to strengthen as it moved northeast and at the intersection of N 1600 East Road and E 3100 North Road, a sizable portion of an eastward facing roof of a house was torn off and deposited in a downstream field. Several trees at this property were damaged including one pine tree whose top half was snapped off and tossed nearly 100 yards to the east. At an adjacent property, a barn was shifted off of its foundation and had a portion of its roof peeled off.

As the tornado reached the Iroquois River, it tore the roof off of a garage and peeled roofing material off of a house at a property next to the river. Extensive tree damage was noted at this property and just to the east along the river, where multiple trees were uprooted and dozens of trees lost limbs. The tornado weakened a bit east of the Iroquois River, but continued to cause tree damage as it approached and crossed N 1800 East Road. A residence along N 1900 East Road and two additional barns along N 2000 East Road were damaged by the tornado. The tornado lifted southwest of St. Anne, shortly after it tipped over an irrigation pivot.

A tornado with peak winds of 85 mph touched down just west of N 1300 East Road near Langan Creek, northeast of Clifton producing minor tree damage. Little to no damage was observed as the tornado moved across open farm fields on either side of Route 45. The tornado peeled roof shingles off a house and damaged multiple farm outbuildings along N 1500 East Road, just north of E 3200 North Road. A barn was blown off of its foundation, while a garage collapsed entirely. The tornado lifted before reaching the Iroquois River as no damage was observed to the tree line along the river.

Storm spotters and chasers captured footage of a funnel cloud south of Martinton that lasted several minutes. Photos and video showed that the funnel cloud was intermittently in contact with the ground as it moved northeast across open fields between N 1900 East Road and N 2400 East Road. The last footage of the funnel cloud was captured around 15:59 CST as it dissipated east of Martinton, south of E 2800 North Road. There was no known damage from this tornado.

Flooding occurred across many areas in northern and central Lake County. In Crown Point, multiple areas were flooded due to clogged storm drains. Flooding was reported near 97th Street and Buchanan Street and South Street near Court Street. Near Hammond, a photo showed Broadmoor Avenue closed at Manor Avenue due to flooding. East of Griffith, street flooding was reported near 47th Avenue and Hatcher Boulevard. Near Gary, a photo showed 4th Avenue at Hamilton Street flooded. Water was also across sidewalks and low-lying sections of yards. In Schererville, a photo showed flooding of yards and fields along Cline Avenue near a cemetery, where the side entrance to the cemetery was inundated. In St. John, widespread flooding occurred. Multiple roadways had flooded sections including at Tall Grass Trail and 93rd Avenue. The retention pond at Prairie Pond Park overflowed into nearby park land. Poor drainage areas were flooded along Parrish Avenue near 85th Avenue with ditches full and nearing the roadway.

**Periods of heavy rain and scattered thunderstorms produced flooding across parts of far northwest Indiana on December 28th. Storm total rainfall amounts included 3.98 inches three miles east of Portage; 3.51 inches in St. John; 3.33 inches one mile east of Schererville; 2.95 inches one mile south of Merrillville; 2.74 inches in Porter and 2.35 inches two miles north northwest of Portage.**
