Street and viaduct flooding were reported in numerous areas in central Chicago generally between Interstate 55 to the south, North Avenue to the north and Cicero Avenue to the west. Water rescues were reported at Western Avenue and Ogden Avenue and at Kinzie Street and Ashland Avenue . At least two viaducts were flooded in North Lawndale and a car was stalled in flood waters on Roosevelt Road just east of California Avenue . The local lanes of Interstate 90 were closed due to flooding between 18th Street and 31st Street. In Garfield Park, a car was submerged in flood waters on West Fulton Street; At least 3 garages were flooded with flood waters rushing like a river down an alley and multiple basements were flooded. Near the Chicago Loop, street flooding was reported along with a viaduct flooded and a photo showed a few inches of standing water at Hubbard's Cave on Interstate 90/94. An estimated 150 basements were flooded in the Near West Side. Street flooding was reported in West Town along with a few basements flooded. In Cicero, a few inches of standing water were reported on streets and sidewalks.				
An automated rain gauge east of Garfield Park reported 5.12 inches of rain in 90 minutes from 19:55 CST to 21:25 CST with a storm total of 5.45 inches. A personal weather station west of the Loop reported 3.81 inches in about 2 hours at 21:43 CST.				
Scattered thunderstorms moved across portions of northeast Illinois during the afternoon and evening of July 8th producing heavy rain. One thunderstorm slowly moved across central Cook County and Chicago in the late evening producing torrential rain and flash flooding.

<p>Torrential rain fell across portions of Rockford , Cherry Valley and Loves Park in a very short time during the late afternoon of July 10th. Several vehicles were stranded in flood waters a few feet deep in multiple locations and street flooding occurred in many areas. Video showed waist deep water on Argus Drive between Buckley Drive and Sundae Drive where at least two cars and a city transit bus were stuck in flood waters. Six passengers were on the bus when it stopped because of the flood waters and there were no injuries reported. A photo showed 2 to 3 feet of standing water on Golf Hill Road at Putter Place. A photo showed water at least one foot deep on Alpine Road at Charles Street. A photo showed flooding along East State Street. Flood waters entered at least one home and one apartment building. One motorist commented that the flooding developed very quickly as they were driving. At least 17 cars were stalled in flood waters, most just past the bottom of the doors but 2 cars had flood waters over the hoods. Hurricane Harbor, an amusement park, was flooded and was closed for 10 days. Rainfall of 2.62 inches in one hour was reported two miles east southeast of Machesney Park at 1626 CST.</p>				

Additional thunderstorms moved across some of the same areas during the early evening with additional flooding reported in Loves Park where flood waters entered the garage of an industrial building on Beacon Street.

Storm total rainfall amounts included 6.50 inches one mile east of Loves Park; 5.05 inches two miles north northwest of Machesney Park; 4.41 inches one mile northwest of Machesney Park; 3.93 inches south southwest of Rockton and 3.78 inches two miles south southeast of Loves Park.
