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strong storm system moved over the Southern Plains. Although local surface observations from the Lubbock Automated Surface Observation System and the Texas Tech University West Texas Mesonet only recorded peak gusts of 50 mph, these gusts were strong enough to down a single high-line wire at the 900 block of East 50th Street in Lubbock shortly before 17:00 CST. The live wire sparked a wind-driven fire that burned a local business. Power also was disrupted in the neighborhood, and was not restored until 21:00 CST. No injuries were reported.
