In Arkansas, ninety six hour (four day) rainfall through 600 am CST on the 30th included 4.67 inches at Harrison (Boone County), 4.12 inches at Mountain Home (Baxter County), 2.91 inches at Pine Bluff (Jefferson County), 2.73 inches at Monticello (Drew County), and 2.38 inches at Russellville (Pope County).
