As the upper level storm system moved closer to the area, severe storms developed during the afternoon of March 6th through the morning of the 7th. One main supercell thunderstorm travelled from southeast Johnson County to Randolph County and was responsible for multiple tornadoes through the evening of March 6th. A strong cold front moved through Arkansas during the day light hours on Friday. In the wake of the front, very cold air surged into the state just ahead of incoming precipitation from the Central Plains. Precipitation began to fall as snow, and remained snow through the duration of the event. Given warm antecedent conditions, snowfall accumulations were mainly confined to elevated surfaces such as grass, trees, vehicles, and roofs. Gusty winds and heavy snow were common across the state, however travel impacts were mainly isolated to bridges and overpasses while bands of moderate to heavy snow were falling.

The Arkansas Dept. of Transportation closed portions of Hwys. 11 and 343 just southeast of Bayou Meto.

A strong system brought severe weather to east Texas on the 21st with mostly just rain and thunderstorms across Arkansas, although nickel size hail was reported near Murfreesboro (Pike County). While severe weather wasn't widespread locally, very heavy rain was seen across Arkansas. Areas from southwest to northeast Arkansas saw rainfall amounts between 2-3 inches into the 22nd. As the rain was departing to the east on the 22nd, some strong winds developed in its wake. Several locations saw gusts to 40 mph or higher for less than an hour. The rain helped improve ongoing drought conditions across southern Arkansas but also worsened ongoing river flooding across the state.

This tornado started southwest of the town of Harmony, moving northeast through town, eventually lifting northeast of Harmony. Mainly tree damage was noted, with tree limbs snapped, uprooted, or trunks snapped. Some light roof damage was also noted to some structures.

**Storms made their way into western Arkansas during the early morning hours of the 30th with one storm producing EF1 tornado near the Harmony community (Johnson County). Storms formed into a line and moved east across the state through the afternoon hours. Ahead of the line of thunderstorms, strong southerly winds were observed across the state. The highest wind gusts were seen across eastern parts of the state.**
