

Regional Climate Summary

February 2020

This February was particularly cool and wet throughout most of our region. Average temperatures ranged from the low 40s to mid 50s which were 2-4°F below normal in many locations. There was quite a contrast between the warmest day and coldest night at MAF due to a record low temperature of 8°F on the 6th. The majority of precipitation this month fell as snow on the 5th-6th. Snowfall totals were remarkable with 8-12" accumulating over the eastern Permian Basin. Another round of snow fell across southeast New Mexico on the 11th-12th. By the conclusion of the month, some areas received 150-200% of normal precipitation.
